

Why Engage in Eucharistic Adoration?

According to St. Pope John Paul II: "Our communal worship at Mass must go together with our personal worship of Jesus in Eucharistic adoration in order that our love may be complete." (*Redeemer of Man*.) In the encyclical Dominicae Cenae, the Holy Father wrote: "The Church and the world have a great need of Eucharistic adoration."

Adoration will take place on Friday, December 3rd, (at 3:00 pm) and <u>December 10th & 17th (at 6:05 pm)</u>. The people who come to this hour of prayer do so in order to find some quiet time to be with God, to discern His movement in their lives, and to dive more deeply into their relationship with the Divine.

Consider attending at least one of these evenings of communal contemplation before the Lord.

Notes from Fr. Nick

Our Lady of Guadalupe

Every December, we celebrate two important solemnities dedicated to the Blessed Mother. This coming Wednesday is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception; a Holy Day of Obligation on which we celebrate the mystery of Mary being born without the stain of Original Sin. (We will have three Masses that day: 8:30 am, 5:30 pm, and 7:30 pm.)

The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe celebrates the apparition of our Blessed Mother in the Americas. People with northern European backgrounds may not fully appreciate the role Our Lady of Guadalupe plays in the life of our brothers and sisters to the south. She is at the very heart of Latino identity. Understanding cultural diversity must include an appreciation of the Blessed Mother of the Americas.

Next Sunday, December 12th, at 4:00 pm, we will celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe in a fusion of Mexican and American traditions. We'll process the image of our Lady of Guadalupe from the church to the Dominican Garden while singing hymns in her homage. We will enthrone her image in the garden and conclude the ceremony by lighting the Parish-School Christmas tree. Afterward we'll enjoy traditional Mexican *pasteles* and *chocolatado*. We hope the celebration will honor both Latin-American and North American cultures.



It is fitting that we honor Mary during Advent. It was her "yes" to God that made the Incarnation (Christmas) possible. Celebrating the Immaculate Conception and Guadalupe ratify our belief that the Paschal Mystery began with a humble girl's acceptance of the will of God in her life.

<u>Combined</u> Procession of The Virgin of Guadalupe and Lighting of our Christmas Tree!

As Fr. Nick has described above, this year we are inaugurating a new tradition in the parish: an original celebration featuring the procession and blessing of our image of the Virgin of Guadalupe. Next Sunday at 4:00 pm, we'll begin with a short liturgy on Berryman Plaza. There we'll light our candles, with which we'll process down Berryman Street and through the two parking lots to the Dominican Garden. Once there, Fr. Nick will bless and incense our image of the Virgin of Guadalupe, we'll sing Marian hymns, and then the celebration of our Christmas Tree will begin, led by the School of the Madeleine Band. After Christmas Carols and the lighting of the Tree, Lourdes Guzman will regale us with Mexican hot chocolate!
