



Advent Penance Service

Tomorrow evening—Monday, December 13th—we will have our Advent Penance Service at 7:30 pm. This is an important part of our preparation of Christmas, and can be a good break from the frenzy that can attack us this time of year.

Reconciliation can be seen as the flip side of Eucharist. While the Eucharist celebrates our joy and thanksgiving to God for entering our lives, penance recognizes the need for God to heal our brokenness. No healthy spirituality contains only one or the other.

Perhaps one reason some people feel a shallowness about the Christmas season is that they often focus only on the positive, 'happy', side of their relationship with God. Although it is good to express joy at the inauguration of our salvation through the birth of the Savior, we also need to recognize that the reason it was necessary for Him to come in the first place was to redeem us for our sins.

During the last couple of Covid-filled years, the polarization of our culture, global warming, and political problems may not seem much to celebrate. Maybe this is the opportunity for our parish to 'clean up our act' as a community and ask for God's mercy.

Our penance service recognizes that all is not right between God and ourselves, neither individually, nor as a congregation. Some soul-searching now will add depth to our experience of the feast. Take an hour out of
