



Reports from our Outreach Ministries

Sunday Dinners for the Hungry —

Because of Covid, we have not served a hot meal in the Parish Hall since March 2020. Starting on April 5, 2020, our parish priests, office staff, and parishioners Florence Wahl and James Pawlak handed out sandwich lunches from the priests' garage, prepared at a discounted price by parishioner Angelo D'Alo, the owner of **Agrodolce Osteria**. Angelo is very reliable, and his delicious food is always delivered on time.

We are grateful for the efforts of all the above parties to keep this Ministry serving those in need, albeit in a different format.

About a year later, a small group of Dinners for the Hungry volunteers took over distributing the sandwiches. By the end of summer 2021, another small group of Dinner volunteers started cooking hot chili in the Parish Hall kitchen as a to-go meal on the first Sunday of the month. We still offer a sandwich lunch (or occasional hot meal) on the fourth Sunday through Agrodolce. All the food is still distributed from the priests' garage.

Many thanks to **Ann Fitzgerald** for her monthly grocery runs, to James Pawlak for providing personal hygiene kits, to the volunteers who dispense the food and cook the chili, and to Florence Wahl for her steady presence opening the garage and directing volunteers for each food handout.

Please note that due to Covid restrictions, we do not yet need additional volunteers. We have no timeline for when dinners will resume in the Parish Hall.

Many thanks to our parishioners for their continued generous financial support of this Ministry.

Holiday Outreach (Giving Iree) —

Notes from Fr. Nick

Our Annual Parish Conference


We had planned to meet in person for our Annual Parish Conference this year, but Diocesan guidelines have caused us to move the conference back to Zoom. One advantage is that it will enable more people to participate.

Evangelization will once again be the conference theme. <u>Jerome Baggett, Ph.D.</u>, a sociologist from the Jesuit School, will be the keynote speaker. Prof. Baggett is currently conducting a research project tentatively entitled "*The Varieties of Irreligious Experience*," on atheists in the United States. Our deacon, **Joel Thompson**, **SJ**, has been working with him on surveying the viewpoints of people who reject a belief in God.

How do we evangelize people who reject our belief in God? Evangelization doesn't necessarily mean converting atheists to the Catholic faith. As a start, I would be happy to explore cordial relationships with them. I would like atheists to understand that Christianity is not a monolith defined by Fundamentalism. The Catholic Church itself rejects Fundamentalism; our theology is lived out in a multitude of expressions. (Many Catholics may also need to be aware of this.)

Beyond this, I'd like to explore the common ground many atheists and Catholics share: a commitment to social justice, the primacy of science and the protection of our environment. I also want people who don't believe in God to feel welcome here with us. I want them to explore the richness of our art, music and literature without feeling pressured to join the Church. I'd like the residents of our neighborhood to see us as a valuable part of our community and a reliable friend in need.

As our 100th anniversary draws near, I hope we will evangelize our community at this foundational level. I believe what we have to offer our community—our faith—will sell itself if we can get beyond their prejudices... and our own past mistakes. We have a lot to learn from each other. Dialogue with atheists, agnostics, people of other religions, Jews, Muslims, and other Christians is part of our journey toward the Kingdom of God.

Jerome Baggett, Ph.D.

Jerome Baggett, our keynote speaker, is Professor of Religion and Society and the Ignacio Ellacuria Professor for Jesuit Studies (Endowed Chair) at the Jesuit School of Theology campus of Santa Clara University.

Professor Baggett is a sociologist who teaches a variety of courses at the Jesuit School, all of which introduce students to sociological theory and method as well as to the complicated dynamics of religion and culture within contemporary society. In addition to many scholarly articles, he has published three books: Habitat For Humanity: Building Private Homes, Building Public Religion, Sense of the Faithful: How American Catholics Live Their Faith, and most recently, The Varieties of Nonreligious Experience: Atheism in American Culture.

Among the courses he currently teaches at the JST: *New Atheism in American Culture, Sociology of American Catholicism,* and *Spirituality and the Religious Quest in America*. Prof. Baggett is currently leading a research project – tentatively entitled *The Varieties of Irreligious Experience* – on atheists in the United States today.

We are fortunate to have Jerome Baggett as our keynote speaker at our Annual Parish Conference this year. He'll answer our questions and share his insights about the challenges we face in evangelizing our neighbors.
