




Picture Puzzle: An Amazing Catch!








Notes from Fr. Nick

The Church on Film

Almost from the days Edison first turned the crank of his movie camera, the Catholic Church has been the subject of film artists. Saint Joan of Arc's life made it to the cinema even before there was sound. If you're of a certain age, *The Song of Bernadette, The Bells of Saint Mary's*, and *Going My Way* probably stirred your Catholic identity and are nostalgic reminders of your youth.

Sad to say, the Church often has been portrayed inaccurately and occasionally blasphemously. In the 1930s, American bishops became so concerned about the moral tenor of movies that they insisted the film industry censure itself. The results were mixed; on the one hand, writers and producers had to take care presenting adult material, and this produced some of most creative scenes on film. In the film *Notorious*, Alfred Hitchcock, a devout Catholic, got around the seven seconds a kiss was allowed to last by having Ingrid Bergmann and Cary Grant embrace and break apart numerous times during the love scene. Hitchcock's creative direction caused the kiss to last over ten minutes; one of the most highly-charged embraces in film history. This was surely more romantic than the explicit sex portrayed today.

On the other hand, film's self-censure often produced a rather naïve look at the world. The "good guy" always had to win by the end of a film. Although this is a nice sentiment, it doesn't square with reality. It almost left the whole genre of tragedy out of the medium. Classical tragedy was permitted, but any new work had to have at least an uplifting ending. After the film censorship office lost its authority, thought-provoking films such as *The Mission* and *Doubt* have deepened our faith as well as entertained us. Last November, actor Max McLean's portrayal of author C.S. Lewis' journey from antagonist to Christian convert graced our theater screens, and is worth a download. (See: tinyurl.com/ReluctantConvert)

Before the pandemic, going to the movies formed a major part of our free time, and watching films at home have helped sustain us during the dark past two years. The parish even attempted a drive-in movie during the lockdown. It is my hope that, as we evolve into a "new normal," films can once again entertain and enlighten us as a parish.
