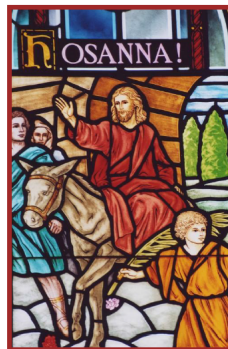

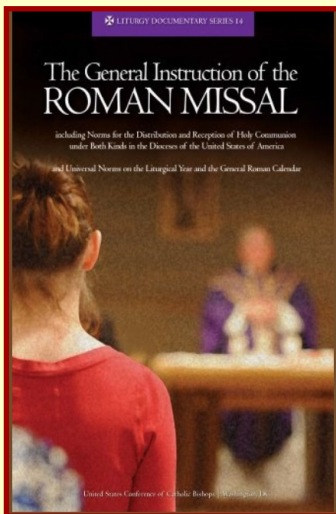

Notes from Fr. Nick

The Triduum

The word *Triduum* reentered the Church's vocabulary after the Second Vatican Council, but it actually names one of our most ancient celebrations. Both **Saint Cyril of Jerusalem** and **Egeria** (in her *Peregrinatio ad Loca Sancta*) attest to these rites in Jerusalem around the year 380. *The rituals of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday were considered one liturgy*, and receiving new Christians into the Church was central to their celebration. The Mass of the Lord's Supper that we will celebrate on Holy Thursday evening commemorated the last supper of Jesus, and began an observance so strict that Eucharist would not be celebrated Saturday evening. This is the 8th-century origin of the procession of the Eucharist out of the main church to another chapel. This is also the Mass in which we follow Jesus' command to serve one another, expressed by washing feet. (John 13:1-11)

Good Friday rituals combine four celebrations: **Proclamation of the Passion, Prayers for the Church and World, Reverencing the Cross**, and a **Communion Service**. In commemoration of Christ's death, the Eucharist is not celebrated.



The **General Instruction of the Roman**

Missal calls the Easter Vigil "*the mother of all vigils.*" (GIRM 21) In the time of Saint Cyril, the Jerusalemites would spend the night in a vigil of prayer, proclaiming the scriptures and singing and praying for those being baptized. At the same time, new Christians — still in the baptistery at this point — would be immersed in the pool and anointed. Afterward, the newly baptized would join the faithful inside the church and receive the Eucharist for the first time.

Our Triduum liturgy is ancient, long, and quirky. If you expect it to follow a logical progression, or be entertaining, you may find yourself a little disconcerted. However, if you allow yourself to let the Holy Spirit take you into its own logic, you will be deeply affected.

Take the time to participate in the whole Triduum—go with the flow— and I guarantee that you will be moved to a deeper faith.

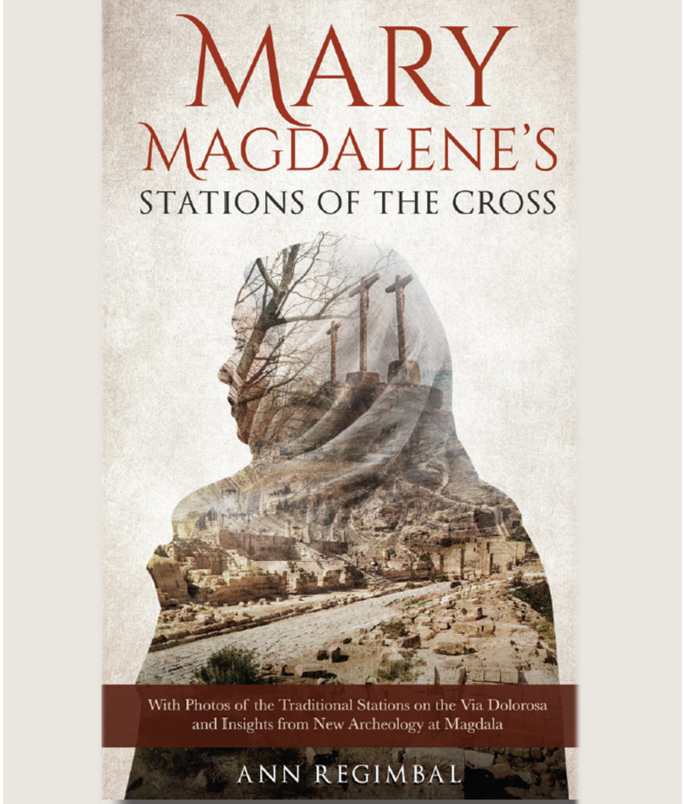

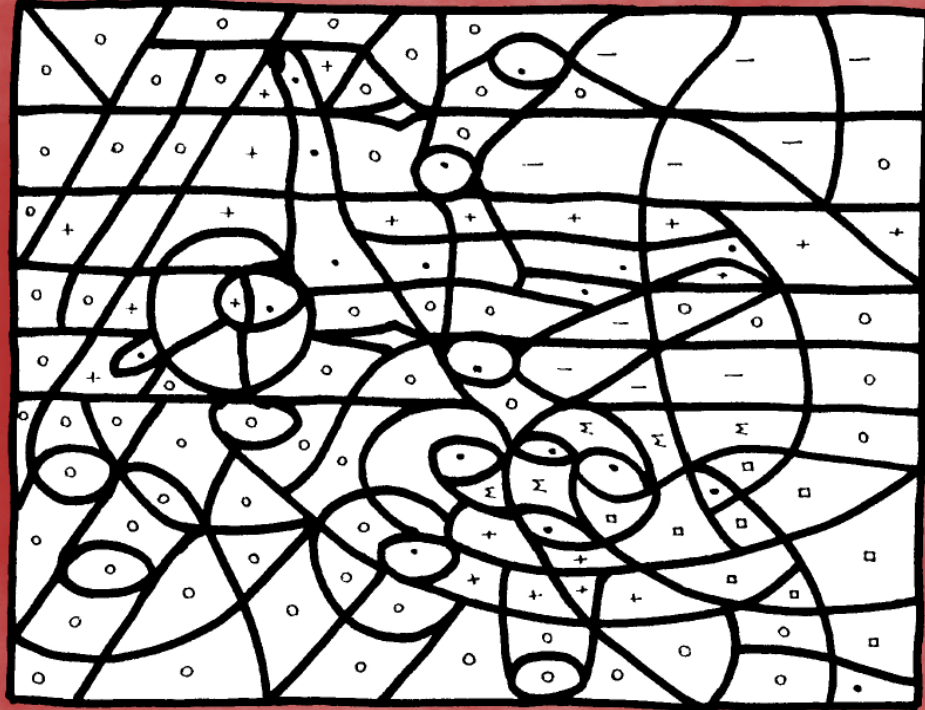


Now an Audio Book!

STANISLAUS WAS BORN TO NOBLE PARENTS IN POLAND IN 1030. HE RECEIVED A GOOD EDUCATION.

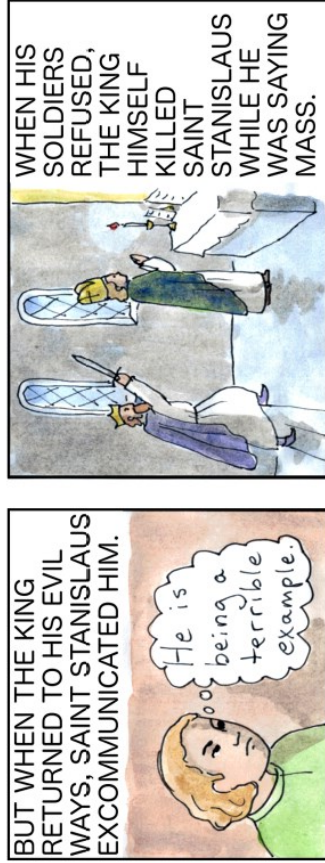
HE WAS ORDAINED A PRIEST AND BECAME A GREAT PREACHER.

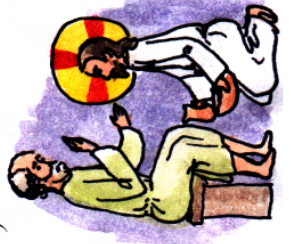

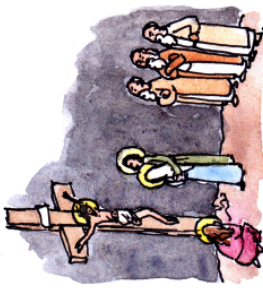

On Good Friday morning, JESUS, who had been arrested the night before, was judged by Pontius Pilate, the ROMAN governor. Pilate had him WHIPPED. Then to make fun of Him the SOLDIERS made a CROWN of THORNS and put it on His head. They threw a purple cloth on Him and beat Him with RODS, saying, "Hail, KING of the JEWS!" Then Pilate had Jesus brought out in front of the people and asked them what they wanted to do with Him. The people, who had welcomed Him into JERUSALEM a few days before with their HOSANNAS, now shouted that He should be crucified.

So Jesus was made to CARRY a heavy CROSS out of the city and up a big HILL. Because He was so weak from being beaten, a man named SIMON of Cyrene was forced to help Him. The soldiers tore off Jesus' CLOTHES and attached Him to the cross with NAILS through His hands and feet.

Jesus offered His life for our SINS. He hung on the cross for three HOURS until He DIED. Nearby were His mother MARY, JOHN the Apostle, and Mary MAGDALEN. After He died a soldier stuck a SPEAR into His side to be sure He was dead.

Did you know that at every MASS we re-offer Jesus' sacrifice on the cross in an unbloody way on the altar?

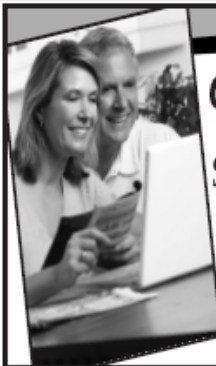
