


documentary, *Valor with Honor*, with a *personal* appearance by the Director & Editor, **Burt Takeuchi**.

Notes from Fr. Nick

Happy Easter!

Easter is a celebration of the "already" and the "not yet." Maybe this is why it is so hard to fathom what it means. The suffering and pain of Jesus' passion are experiences with which most of us can identify — after all, we've all felt pain, rejection and grief. On the other hand, while Christ's resurrection is a historical fact for us, none of us have experienced this transcendence ourselves. The soaring joy of Easter comes from the knowledge that it is accomplished in Jesus (the "already") but requires faith that it will come to pass for us (the "not yet").


The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., said, "Faith is taking the first step even when you don't see the whole staircase." Although his words can apply to many things, they are a good way for us to look at Easter. We believe in the resurrection because the Scriptures relate its story as Christ's ultimate triumph. We are able to live as if we will be resurrected people because we have experienced the love of God in our lives. However, we must still "climb the steps" toward our own resurrection as an act of faith.

Today, we celebrate Christ's resurrection as an act of faith that what the Father did for Christ he will do for


Now an Audio Book!






