





Notes from Fr. Nick

Kerygma

Continuing our series of Greek words frequently heard but rarely defined, kerygma literally means "to cry or proclaim as herald." Generally, the word kerygma signifies the teachings of Jesus. When preachers or scholars refer to the kerygma of a Gospel passage, they are referring to the stories and statements that Jesus made in that chapter.


Often, scholars of Scripture will remark on the way Jesus chooses to address a topic. An example might be Jesus' response to the woman caught in adultery, when he stoops down and begins writing in the sand until all the accusers have departed. Then he looks up and says, "Woman, has no one condemned you? Then go on your way and sin no more."



In this story, Jesus doesn't force a confrontation with the accusers, he doesn't place the woman on trial or add conditions to her being forgiven. Stooping down and writing in the sand adds dramatic emphasis that allows the authorities time to reconsider their behavior. All these aspects highlight the unique nature of Jesus' teaching. The dramatic way in which Jesus allows his forgiveness to unfold is as much part of the story — as much part of the *kerygma* — as its content.

Further, the literary styles of the authors of the Gospels may also influence our view of how an event in Jesus' ministry is told. There are many records of Jesus feeding the multitudes, but what the author chooses to include in a story, as well as how he expresses it, also influences our understanding of the *kerygma*.

There are many accounts of Jesus feeding the multitudes, but the details vary from one author to another. Matthew said Jesus had the people sit in the grass, while Luke states that Jesus directed the disciples to "sit in groups of about fifty each." Mark has the people sit in the "green grass in hundreds and fifties." In the Gospel of John, Jesus says, "Have the people sit down; there is plenty of grass in the place."

I understand that the way
Mark describes the scene
can be traced to an ancient
Semitic phrase that translates
something like, "they were
seated like garden plots" in
"armies of flowers." It can be
seen from this example that
each Evangelist chose to
emphasize different aspects
of the same event.

Knowing a little about the literary style of the author, and the audience to whom he was writing, explains the *kerygmatic* nature of the story.

Longtime Leader of Parish St. Vincent de Paul Conference Dies

Richard Wentworth Vohs entered eternal life in the early hours of Easter Sunday morning. His sudden departure was a shock to his family and friends, and especially to the members of the St. Mary Magdalen Conference of St. Vincent de Paul, which, since the passing of veteran leader Joe McWalters in 2016, would perhaps not have survived, if not for Richard's steady guidance.

Richard Vohs grew up in Berkeley, and shared childhood stories of scores of people standing outside our church, waiting for Mass to end so they could enter the next one. As a merchant marine, Richard later attended Mass all over the world, as he navigated countless U.S. cargo ships for over 40 years. Richard's funeral Mass was celebrated Friday morning at St. Ambrose; he was buried in Lafayette.
