



Peace & Justice Notes

Help End Hunger – Last weekend *The School of the Madeleine* and *St. Mary Magdalen Paris*h participated in the annual CROP Walk sponsored by *Church World Service* to raise awareness about worldwide hunger. Thank you to all who pledged donations and/or joined the walk! *Now there is more to do.*

We need our elected officials to endorse and pass the *Global Malnutrition Prevention and Treatment Act of 2021 (HR 4693*). This Bill was introduced in July 2021; so far neither Rep. Barbara Lee nor Rep. Mark DeSaulnier have signed on as sponsors! The *Stop Child Hunger Act of 2021 (S. 1831)* was introduced in the Senate and is co-sponsored by Senator Alex Padilla, but the Bill has not moved forward.

The *Peace & Justice Committee* is organizing a letter campaign from May 8th through 22nd to get these Bills passed. Our postcards and letters will be hand-delivered to our representatives; no postage or mailing required. Our *Offering of Letters* will join those of many parishes nationwide.


Just pick up pre-addressed postcards in the vestibule this weekend and write a brief note to either Congresswoman Lee (Alameda County residents) or Congressman DeSaulnier (Contra Costa County residents) urging them to sign on to *HR* 4693 and **get it passed**. Ask Senator Feinstein to sponsor the Senate version of the bill. And let's thank Senator Padilla for his sponsorship! Postcards can be left in the vestibule or the parish office.

Alternatively, as in the past, you can sign preprinted letters. These will be available at tables after Mass on the weekend of May 14th and 15th. However, personal letters are more effective than 'pro-forma' letters, so we encourage you to write in your own words. Information and sample letters are posted on our parish website.

Background: Hunger is more widespread each year for many reasons, most often linked to war, climate change, and political or economic instability. Recently COVID has had an impact on food markets. The UN's <u>State of Food Security and Nutrition in the World 2021 Report estimates that between 720 and 811 million people went hungry in 2020. Children are especially harmed: in 2020, 149.2 million (22.0 percent) of children under the age of five years suffered from stunted growth.</u>

A month from now, my Mom will be 94 years old. She's still living (with one of my broth-


ers, who recently retired) at her home in North Florida, enjoying her books and the beautiful countryside. I hope to visit her on her birthday on June 15th.

She is still with you spiritually, and she still enriches your life through her memory and what she taught you.

deal with the chaos. Unwittingly, my parents taught us those good habits, too.

IZ was born in Honolulu, Hawai'i, in 1999 and passed away far too soon at the age of 38, to the great sorrow of his family, friends, and countless fans. 

Fred Toyosaburo Korematsu was an American civil rights icon who resisted the barbarous interm-ment of over 120,000 Americans of Japanese descent during World War II. He became a symbol toft the resistance and was eventually awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1998. 


