



How to Help Immigrants at our Southern Border Last year, our parish contributed generously to the Rio Grande Valley Humanitarian Respite Center, an outreach of Catholic Charities of the Rio Grande Valley. The Center is still helping immigrants who have been allowed to enter our country. Located in the border town of McAllen, Texas, the Respite Center is open 7 days a week (including holidays), and provides the immigrants a place to rest, a warm meal, a shower, clean clothing, medicine and supplies. When immigrants arrive, the center helps them to contact family members and provides them with bus tickets to reach their destination.

Help End Gun Violence—Walk with St. Columba

Our neighboring parish of St. Columba has long been an active member of **Ceasefire**, a program that brings together law enforcement, clergy, and community members to help reduce gun violence in Oakland. St. Columba maintains a garden in front of the church where they place a white cross each time a life in Oakland is lost to homicide, and they also sponsor community walks throughout the year to bring awareness to the cause of ending gun violence in Oakland neighborhoods.

You may join the walkers at 6:00 pm on June 17th. The church is located at 6401 San Pablo Blvd. The hour-long walks begin with prayer in the church. Signs are provided, and all are welcome.

Pentecost



With the feast of Pentecost, we end the fifty days of celebrating Easter. The Church intends the Easter season to be a mirror image of Lent. To me, it seems a little paradoxical that while we are able to enter the Lenten season with fervor and — for the most part — sustain our acts of sacrifice through Holy Week, we have a much harder time holding on to the celebratory atmosphere of the Easter season. The flowers soon wilt, our "Alleluias" become a little forced, and we start to settle into summer rhythms long before Pentecost.

Perhaps our difficulty with sustained celebration is that it runs the risk of becoming shallow. Our minds and hearts are programmed to

find meaning in adversity, but they become a little lazy about sustaining joy. Celebration is not normative in this world; nevertheless, it is a state of being we must practice, because we are told in the Scriptures that it will be the rule in Heaven. Learning to maintain the Easter spirit of gratitude and joy — without falling into indolence — is an excellent preparation for entering the Kingdom of God.
