



Help End Gun Violence: Walk with St. Columba

Our neighboring parish of St. Columba has long been an active member of <u>Ceasefire</u>, a program that brings together law enforcement, clergy, and community members to help reduce gun violence in Oakland. St. Columba maintains a garden in front of the church where they place a white cross each time a life in Oakland is lost to homicide.



The memorial crosses planted in the garden of St. Columba's church.


They also sponsor community walks throughout the year to bring awareness to the cause of ending gun violence in Oakland neighborhoods.

You may join the walkers at 6:00 pm this Friday, June 17th. The hour-long walks begin with prayer in the church before the walk. Signs are provided, and everyone is welcome.

Hidden Mercy



At the end of March, I met with Deacon Jeff Burns in San Diego. While he is assigned as our deacon here at St. Mary Magdalen parish, Deacon Jeff is currently on the faculty at the University of San Diego, and he also works in the pastoral ministry office there. If all goes well, he and his wife, Sabina, will return to the Bay Area permanently after he retires in February.

Jeff invited me to a presentation by the journalist Michael J. O'Loughlin, who had come to San Diego to discuss his recent book, *Hidden Mercy*, which is about the response of the Catholic Church to the AIDS crisis during the 1980s and 90s. Although sometimes painful, it's an eminently readable work about a difficult faith struggle faced by many dying gay men, and the Church's ambivalent response to their situation.

Much of the story centers around the brave laypeople, priests, and nuns who showed care and compassion to these men at a time when not much was understood about the disease and there were no effective treatments. They had to battle prejudice from Fundamentalist reactionaries who claimed that AIDS was "God's punishment," Catholic hierarchy who were often unbending on Church rules, and political leaders who used the

crisis for their own ends. Ultimately, it was the compassionate care sufferers received, and Pope Francis' famous remark, "Who am I to judge?" that began to defuse the impasse.

The book is also about O'Loughlin's endeavor to remain an active Catholic as a gay man. He and his partner found a welcoming parish in Chicago where, he learned later, the community had had to come to terms with their own prejudices when a beloved pastor died of AIDS.

This book is about nuances. Must one be "all in" on a matter to be considered an ally? How can one show compassion and at the same time journey toward a deeper understanding of something uncomfortable or even frightening? What does it mean to be merciful? O'Loughlin's conclusion is while there were major missteps along the way, the Church's direct care for AIDS sufferers met with Saint Augustine's dictum, "Love God and do what you will." God's love was the guiding principle, and it truly manifested Christ in His Church.

"Instead of indifference, alienation and even condemnation, these people let themselves be moved by the mercy of the Father and allowed that to become their own life's work; a discreet mercy, silent and hidden, but still capable of sustaining and restoring the life and history of each one of us," Pope Francis wrote. In 1987, The U.S. Conference of Bishops issued a document urging the faithful to provide pastoral care to those suffering due to the AIDS pandemic. It also condemned discrimination against people with AIDS as "unjust and immoral." - 11/15/2021






