Peace & Justice Notes

Gun Violence: President Biden has signed into law *The Bipartisan Safer Communities Act*– the 1st Federal gun legislation since Congress let the Assault Weapon Ban expire in 1994. However, this legislation does **not** ban assault weapons. The *United States Conference of Catholic Bishops* “has consistently supported the sensible regulation, sale, and use of firearms. On June 3, the USCCB sent a letter to all members of Congress urging lawmakers to “unite in their humanity to stop the massacres of human lives” and to advance life-saving legislation to address gun violence. On June 23, the USCCB sent a letter to all members of Congress in support of the **Bipartisan Safer Communities Act.**”

Capital Punishment: The Biden Administration issued a moratorium on Federal executions upon taking office, reversing the previous Administration’s accelerated resumption of executions. The Trump Justice Department executed 13 people in a six-month period, with three executions carried out less than ten days before the inauguration of a president who publicly affirmed his opposition to capital punishment. Twenty-three states have now abolished capital punishment, while three states (including California) have a moratorium. Archbishop Joseph Naumann of Kansas City (Kansas), chairman of the USCCB’s Committee on Pro-Life Activities, has said about the Federal moratorium:

“The Catholic Church has consistently taught that every person is created in the image and likeness of God, and for this reason we consistently uphold the sacred dignity of all human life. **The U.S. bishops have also long called for an end to the death penalty, and we do so in unity with Pope Francis who has also advocated for an end to capital punishment globally.**”

What actions are the U.S. Bishops taking to turn that core belief into policy in the United States?

Notes from Fr. Nick

Freedom of Speech

As we celebrate Independence Day this week, I'd like to concentrate on one particular freedom we Americans say we hold dear: *freedom of speech*. I'm not talking about journalism, or what can be said in political ads. Rather, I'm talking about how we, personally, observe freedom of speech.

When I lived in London, a statement I heard British people make over and over again was, "I may not agree with you, but I will defend your right to say it." Most Americans would concur with that statement in principle, but the difference seemed to be that the British people I met really meant it. What's more, they *listened* to what I had to say. The result was some of the most stimulating political, philosophical, theological, and church discussions I've ever had. Often I changed their minds and they changed mine.

If you are making a point, do you try to form it carefully without side issues that might distract your listener from the essence of what you are trying to say? Do you let others finish their thought before responding? Are you looking for weaknesses in others' argument or do you give them the benefit of doubt? Do you try to distort their ideas?

Our level of discourse often descends to talking at people rather than to them. Sometimes I think we are more concerned with hearing ourselves than others. While we may finish our speech more convinced than ever that we are right, we may have missed an opportunity to learn and grow. When it's all over, if we still don't agree, we may learn better ways to counter others' arguments.



When Jesus dined with public officials, tax collectors and sinners, I doubt that he spent most of his time preaching. As a preacher, I know how ineffective this method can be. I suspect that Jesus really listened to his hosts and tried to understand their point of view. Only when it became clear that he had little common ground with them did he condemn their behavior. Even then, he still sought to leave the door open for listeners to change.

Freedom of speech assumes civil discourse. If we expect politicians and other leaders to use this freedom wisely, we must begin by conducting conversations around the

dinner table, at work and in meetings with a sense of the fairness and the open-mindedness that Jesus exemplified in his public ministry.

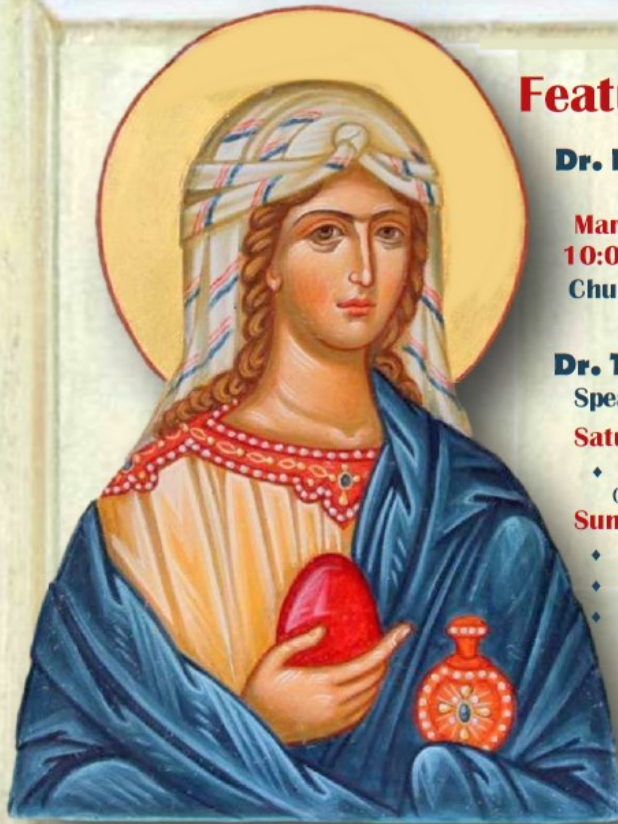

The Rev. Canon Dr. Lizette Larson-Miller is the Huron Lawson Professor of Liturgy at Huron University College in London, Ontario. She has pastored churches in the U.S., Canada, and the Church of England. Her particular interests are late antiquity and early medieval liturgical history; rites and rituals with the sick, the dying, and the dead; as well as contemporary sacramental theology and sacramentality. She is the past president of *Societas Liturgica* and the *International Anglican Liturgical Consultation*. Dr. Larson-Miller holds two degrees in music, an M.A. in liturgical studies from St. John's University, and a Ph.D. in liturgical studies from the GTU in Berkeley. Her most recent book is *Sacramentality Renewed: Contemporary Conversations in Sacramental Theology*.



Dr. Tanisha Sparks is the Director of Finance & Administration for the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley. She is also a Global Minister for Tanisha Sparks Ministries, where she serves as Preacher, Guest Lecturer, Conference and Retreat Speaker, Counselor, and Business and Project Manager. She previously served as a youth minister at four churches in the East Bay. Dr. Sparks received her undergraduate and M.B.A. degrees from Holy Names University, her M.Div. from the American Baptist Seminary of the West, and her Doctorate in Ministry, Biblical Interpretation and Proclamation from the Candler School of Theology of Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia.

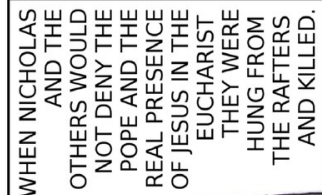
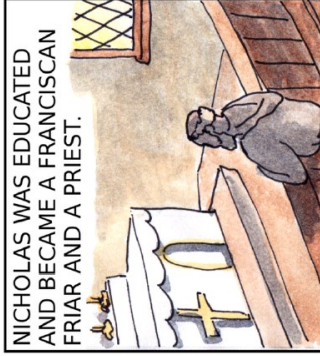

Like 10:1-12, 17-20



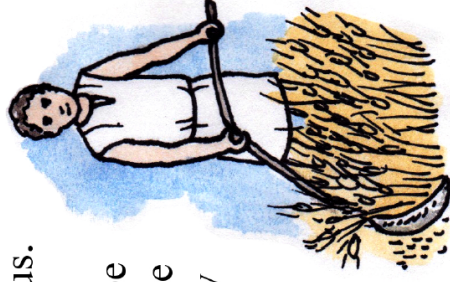
I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves.
