



lary Magdalen Festival

After two years of virtual festivals, we're happy to gather in person for our Fifth Annual Mary Magdalen Festival. By the time you read this, our Saturday, July 23rd festivities may have already occurred. If you've missed our academic lecture, you will soon be able to watch it via the link on our website. Our speaker this year is the **Rev. Dr. Lizette Larson-Miller**, and her talk is *entitled "Misconceptions and New Conceptions: Knowing Saint Mary Magdalen in Our Lives"*. You may also have attended the Saturday afternoon tea party/fundraiser in our Parish Hall, catered by parishioner Lourdes Guzman. If you have attended our tea parties, you know what a delight these parish socials are.

On Saturday evening and Sunday, the **Rev. Dr. Tanisha Sparks** is giving reflections on Saint Mary Magdalen at all our weekend Masses. At 12:30 pm this Sunday afternoon, a potluck will take place in the Rectory, with some concurrent activities for children. Please see page five of this Bulletin or our website for more information.

Both of our featured speakers come from non-Catholic faith backgrounds. We hope they will provide us with new perspectives on our parish patron, and encourage ecumenical dialogue in the process. I've heard both of them speak in the past, and I know they will give a creative take on this dynamic saint who is becoming more appreciated as a seminal figure in the early Church.

Covid-19 is still around, but it looks like something we'll have to learn to live with. Yes, there is still the possibility of encountering the virus in large groups, but I hope that everybody has received the vaccine (and boosters, if eligible) by now. And, while there are risks in gathering, there are also risks from isolation. Many experts speculate that the emotional damage caused by isolation will be with us long after the virus has receded. Immunocompromised people and those who remain unvaccinated should take special precautions, but we shouldn't underestimate the toll that continued isolation can take.

The **Rev. Dr. Tanisha Sparks** is a graduate of the American Baptist Seminary of the West, a school of the GTU, where she received her Master of Divinity degree in Preaching and a Certificate in Black Church/Africana Studies in May 2012. She holds a B.A. in Business Administration and an M.B.A. in Leadership and Management, both from Holy Names University. In May 2019, Dr. Sparks received her Doctor of Ministry degree in Biblical Interpretation and Proclamation from the Candler School of Theology at Emory University in Atlanta.



Currently, Dr. Sparks serves as the Director of Finance and Administration at the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley. In addition to her full time position, she also serves at Santa Clara University and at the JST as a guest preacher and guest lecturer on topics such as African American Spirituality, Black Christology, and African and African American Liberation Theology. She is also an Associate Minister at the historic Allen Temple Baptist Church in Oakland.

The **Rev. Canon Dr. Lizette Larson-Miller** is the Huron Lawson Professor of Liturgy at Huron University College in London, Ontario. She has pastored churches in the U.S., Canada, and the Church of England. Her particular interests are late antiquity and early medieval liturgical history; rites and rituals with the sick, the dying, and the dead; and contemporary sacramental theology and sacramentality. She is the past




president of *Societas Liturgica* and the *International Anglican Liturgical Consultation*. Dr. Larson-Miller holds two degrees in music, an M.A. in liturgical studies from St. John's University, and a Ph.D. in liturgical studies from the GTU in Berkeley. Her most recent book is *Sacramentality Renewed*: *Contemporary Conversations in Sacramental Theology*.



The **Rev**. **Dr**. **Tanisha Sparks** is the Director of Finance & Administration for the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley and Associate Minister at Allen Temple Baptist Church in Oakland. Dr. Sparks received her undergraduate and M.B.A. degrees from Holy Names University, her M.Div. from the American Baptist Seminary of the West (a GTU school), and her Doctorate in Ministry, Biblical Interpretation and Proclamation from the

Candler School of Theology of Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia. In 2020, Dr. Sparks received a Congressional Recognition Award from Rep. Ro Khanna for her commitment and dedication to the African-American church and community in the Bay Area.

Parishioner & Spiritual Director Sharon Henthorn-Iwane understands iconography as a sacred art that "makes the invisible visible." Through this intensive workshop, Sharon will guide you through the traditional process of painting an icon of your own in egg tempera with genuine gold gilding on a gessoed panel. In addition to hands-on art instruction, Sharon will also discuss the role of icons in the history of the Church, and provide resources for ongoing exploration.

Workshop details

Participants will gather in the Parish Hall daily, Monday through Saturday, from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm. A delicious lunch will be provided for folks to eat on the grounds, or on walks in the neighborhood. Monday through Friday will be devoted to the painting of your icon, with Saturday ending with a public showing and blessing of the icons. All needed art supplies will be provided, and will be yours to keep upon completion of the workshop. Students will have the choice of painting an icon of either the Virgin and Child or a Pantocrator icon of Jesus.


