CEASEFIRE



Ceasefire is an innovative program bringing together law enforcement, clergy, and community members, including the Diocese of Oakland, to help reduce gun violence. Bishop Michael Barber describes *Ceasefire* as “a good movement, because it shows that people of faith care, and we can express our care in a public way, reaching out to everybody, whether religious or not. We care about everybody.”

The **Night Walks** are especially community-affirming. They are sponsored by participating congregations and held frequently throughout the year. The hour-long gatherings begin at 6:00 pm with prayer; then signs are given out at the start of the neighborhood walk. Notes from Fr. Nick

Saint Dominic

August 8th is the feast of St. Dominic de Guzmán, OP. He was born in 1170, the son of prominent parents in the town of Caleruega, Spain. He was named in honor of St. Dominic of Silos, patron of barren mothers and of the Lord's Day (Sunday is *Domingo* in Spanish).

There is a story that after his mother made a pilgrimage to the shrine of Dominic of Silos while trying to get pregnant she had a dream. In it a dog leapt from her womb carrying a torch in his mouth setting the earth on fire. This story probably emerged after the order Dominic founded became known as the *Dominicans*; a play on the Latin name for the order, *Dominicanus*, and the Latin phrase, *Domini canis*, which means "Dog of the Lord." This, in turn, refers to the order's chief charism: *preaching*. The Dominicans are officially known as the Order of Preachers.

Early in his career, Dominic concentrated on his studies, but when a famine broke out in Spain he sold all his clothes and even the manuscripts he was studying. He explained to his fellow students, "*Would you have me study off these dead skins, when men are dying of hunger?*"

In 1206, Dominic founded a community of women religious, and 1215, Dominic established an order for men, following the monastic rules of Saint Benedict, and was given authority to preach. This was the year of the Fourth Lateran Council and he traveled to Rome to ask Pope Innocent III's approval for his order. A year later, in 1216, the new pope, Honorius III, officially recognized the order.

St. Dominic established the headquarters of the Order of Preachers at the basilica of Santa Sabina in Rome. He spent the remainder of his life preaching and traveling, starting new friaries throughout Europe, until his death on August 6, 1221. The Dominicans quickly established a reputation for scholarship, which they still enjoy today. Eclipsing even Dominic himself in fame is St. Thomas Aquinas, a Dominican theologian known in and out of the Church as one of the greatest intellects in Western history.

If you've been coming to St. Mary Magdalen Church for more than five years, you will know the long association this parish has had with the Dominicans. If you have arrived more recently, you've perhaps observed the Dominican Shields in the church architecture or the symbols in the tympanum over the entrance. The priests of the Western Dominican Province founded our parish in 1923, and staffed it until 2017, when I arrived. The School of the Madeleine is still affiliated with the Dominican sisters of Mission San José, one of whom still serves in our kindergarten.

Our parish has a major debt of gratitude to the Order of Preachers, and we hope they will continue to feel welcome here as we begin our second century.

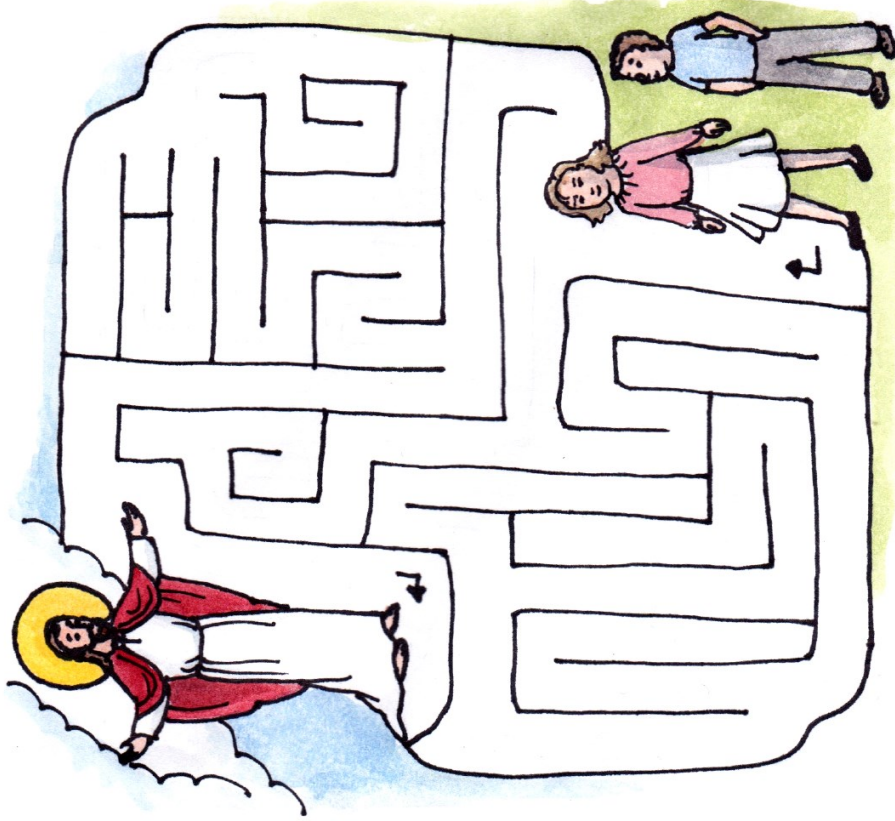

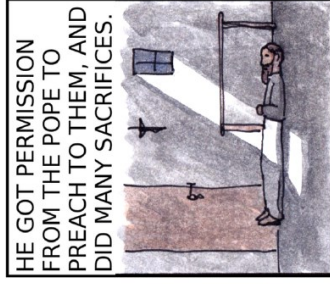
