





Sansei Granddaughters' Journey: From Remembrance to Resistance

An exhibit honoring the history of the incarceration of Japanese Americans during World War II, featuring five Bay Area women artists (*see below*), is open at **AZ Gallery** through September 3rd.



The location was chosen because AZ Gallery is situated in the Tanforan Mall, and in 1942, the Tanforan racetrack was turned into a temporary detention center for many Bay Area Japanese Americans before they were sent to internment camps. AZ Gallery is located at 1150 El Camino Real in San Bruno. The exhibit is open Wednesdays through Sundays, and admission is free.

Notes from Fr. Nick





One of the most distressing absences during the pandemic was the distinctive sound of children on our school playground. A sound we often took for granted was absent and sorely missed. Happily, the laughter, screams, and banter were back full force for most of 2022. For all its trials, the School of the Madeleine survived and grew stronger during these difficult times. I look forward to our students' return this week.

One priority that Principal Joseph Nagel, the School Board, and faculty are emphasizing since the pandemic is to diversify our student body. This may not be quite what you think. Our students already represent a broad cross-section of Berkeley's culture. Where we may not do so well is in *economic* diversity. We are now the only Catholic elementary school in the city, and so we have a responsibility to include students from a larger swath of our community's income levels.

We are fortunate that many people have stepped forward to offer scholarships to students from families who may not be able to budget our school's actual tuition. The facilities are capable of accommodating about 30 more students than are currently enrolled, while keeping class sizes at appropriate levels. Some grades have more room than others, but it seems a shame to have empty desks when we know we offer an education of extraordinary quality.

of the Madeleine Dominican Garden.


Top left: Fr. Nick called the members of the Jackson family to stand before the plaque as the ceremony commenced.




