

Notes from Fr. Nick

St. Francis & Laudato Si'

Most of you know that when Jorge Bergoglio was elected Pope, he chose the name Francis to honor Saint Francis of Assisi. He is devoted to St. Francis because of the saint's devotion to the poor and his communion with all creation, particularly animals.

You may not be aware that the opening words of the pope's encyclical on the environment, Laudato Sí', are his homage to St. Francis' song in praise of creation, known as the Canticle of the Sun. Those same words are found in the saint's majestic hymn. Most of us are used to the musical settings by Marty Haugen or Amy Beach that rearranged the lyrics to fit their melody, but here, in fact, is how the canticle begins:

Original Umbrian (dialect of Italian) Altissimu, onnipotente bon Signore, Tue so le laude, la gloria e l'honore et onne benedictione....

English Translation O Most high, all-powerful, good Lord God, to you belong praise, glory, honor and all blessing.... Be praised, my Lord, for all your creation

and especially for our Brother Sun....

Laudato si', mi Signore, cum tucte le Tue creature, spetialmente messor lo frate Sole....

Laudato si', mi Signore, per sora Luna e le stelle...

Be praised, my Lord, through Sister Moon and the stars...

Saint Francis' declaration that all creation is sacred is prescient for us at this critical juncture in the history of our planet. Human activity has burdened our biosphere to the point where it can be irrevocably damaged. Care for our environment isn't just a practical consideration for us; it is a faith commitment. Even if we weren't damaging our home,

we would still need to care for it, because it is God's gift to us.


Dr. Jane Goodall, the famous primatologist, is positively hopeful about the future of our planet, because she believes in the innate goodness in human beings and she also believes that our Creator is directing us to care for our planet. Two great minds of our times, one a scientist and the other a religious leader, concur that our planet is in peril, action is needed now, and that we will ultimately see the crisis through, with God's help.

As we bless our pets this weekend, we need to pray for all of creation: the inanimate, animate, sentient, and reasoning members of creation. We should remember that as stewards of creation, we are not here to

exploit it, but to care for, safeguard, and ensure its future as a treasure from God.

St. Mary Magdalen Parish Celebrates National Hispanic American Heritage Month

Ellen Ochoa (1958 - present)



Ellen Ochoa is an American engineering researcher, former astronaut, and former director of the NASA Johnson Space Center. In 1993, Ochoa became the first Latina to fly in space, and she later became the first Latina to direct the Johnson Space Center.

Ellen Lauri Ochoa was born on May 10, 1958 in Los Angeles, the same year NASA began. Her paternal grandparents had immigrated from Sonora, Mexico, to Arizona, and later to California where her father was born. Ochoa and her siblings grew up in El Cajon; neither of their parents had college degrees. Ochoa received a B.S. in physics from San Diego State University, and earned a Ph.D. in Electrical Engineering from Stanford. While she was working on her doctorate, NASA's Space Shuttle program started accepting women and minority astronauts. Inspired by Sally Ride (also a Stanford graduate), the first American woman to fly in space, Dr. Ochoa began working at NASA's Ares Research Center, where she soon applied to NASA's Astronaut Training Program, finally getting accepted in 1990.

After three years of training, Dr. Ochoa joined the crew of Space Shuttle Discovery, and in 1993, became the first Latina to go into space. Her first mission lasted nine days, and she completed three other space flights, logging 1000 hours in space. After she retired as an astronaut, Ochoa took on leadership roles at NASA, serving as the first Mexican American to lead NASA's Johnson Space Center, from 2013 to 2018.

"When I was going to college, I had this idea that you do research in a vacuum.... But when you get to NASA, you realize [doing research] is a team sport... and what you're working on has benefits for humanity.


A lot of engineering is solving problems here on earth, and I think that's something that appeals to all people, but it certainly appeals to women to solve problems, to satisfy that curiosity. And working in teams to achieve that goal really appeals to a lot of people."

St. Mary Magdalen Parish Celebrates National Hispanic American Heritage Month

Sen. Alex Padilla

(1973 ~ present)



Alex Padilla is the first Hispanic-American U.S. Senator from the State of California. His parents were both immigrants from Mexico who met and married in Los Angeles, where he was born His father worked as a short-order cook for 40 years, and his mother was a housekeeper. After graduating from San Fernando High School, he earned a B.S. in mechanical engineering from MIT. His first position was as an engineer at Hughes Aircraft.

Padilla's interest in politics was sparked in 1994 with the proposal of Proposition 187, a ballot crafted by anti-immigrant organizations, which would have excluded undocumented workers from receiving nonemergency public services, such as public education and healthcare. (Prop. 187 was never enacted, because it was found to be unconstitutional under the Equal Protection Clause of the 14th amendment.) The following year, Padilla became the personal assistant to Senator Diane Feinstein, eventually serving as the campaign manager for Assemblyman Tony Cardenas in 1996, Assemblyman Gil Cedillo in 1997,

and State Senator Richard Alarcon in 1998, all of whom won their respective elections. In 1999, Padilla became a member of the Los Angeles City Council and two years later, at the age of 28, he was elected its President, becoming the youngest person in city history and the first Latino in over 100 years to hold that position. During his term, he was also elected the first-ever Latino president of the California League of Cities. He won election to the California State Senate in 2006, and during his two terms as State Senator, he was named as one of Sacramento's "most effective legislators." He sponsored and passed more than 70 bills, among them laws to fight climate change, including a ban on plastic bags. Padilla was elected California's Secretary of State in 2014 and re-elected in 2018. In December of 2020, Governor Newsom appointed Padilla to fill the position of U.S. Senator vacated by Kamala Harris after she became Vice-President of the United States. He is currently running for re-election for a full six-year term in the United States Senate.

Capt. Linda Garcia Cubero

(1958 - present)



Air Force Captain (Ret.) Linda Garcia Cubero was the first woman of Latino background to graduate from a military service academy in the United States, and was the first woman from Massachusetts to receive an appointment to any military academy. Her father is Mexican American and her mother is from Puerto Rico.

After graduation, Garcia Cubero spent seven years in the Air Force, serving as a command briefer to a fourstar general and on national-level task forces at the Pentagon, during which time she earned a Joint Service Commendation Medal for her work in the Falkland Islands conflict. As a White House liaison officer, she supervised the development of a commemorative postage stamp honoring Latinos in the U.S. military.

While in the Air Force, Garcia Cubero served as mentor to Latino Air Force cadets, particularly women. She left the Air Force in 1987 to marry a civilian and start a family, and immediately furthered her education, earning a Master's Degree in Systems Engineering from Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

After her graduation, Garcia Cubero worked as a senior systems engineer for GE Aerospace, followed by roles at EDS, Hewlett Packard, and Bradley-Morris, eventually becoming President and Owner of Falcon Cash Investments, while continuing to volunteer in the wider Latino community. For her community service, she was awarded the 1991 Hispanic Engineer National Achievement Pioneer Award. She is now a Warriors to Work Specialist at the Wounded Warrior Project, a position she has held since 2014.

Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez

(1989 - present)



Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez — best known by her initials, "AOC" — is the Representative for New York's 14th Congressional District. When she took office in January 2019, at the age of 29, she became the youngest woman ever to serve in the United States Congress. She is currently running for her third term. Alexandria was born in the Bronx borough of New York City on October 13, 1989. Her father (also born in the Bronx) was of Puerto Rican heritage, and her mother was born in Puerto Rico. When she was five years old, her family moved to suburban Westchester County, where she graduated from Yorktown High School in 2007. In 2011, she graduated *cum luade* from Boston University with a double major in


international relations and economics. While attending Boston University, she served as an intern for Massachusetts Senator Ted Kennedy, focusing on foreign affairs and immigration. Being the only Spanish speaker in the office, she would answer the calls of worried family members trying to find loved ones who had been taken by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and help the families to navigate the system.

After graduation, she returned to the Bronx and took a job as a waitress and bartender to help her mother, a housecleaner and school bus driver, fight foreclosure of their home. In 2016, she travelled across America as an organizer for Bernie Sanders, visiting places such as North Dakota, where she was inspired by the 200 tribes who supported the Sioux of Standing Rock Reservation in their (still ongoing) fight against the construction of the Dakota Oil Pipeline proposed to be built on their land.

Ocasio-Cortez is a proudly progressive politician. She supports the policies of single-payer Medicare for All, enacting gun control and the Green New Deal, ending the privatization of prisons, and abolishing ICE. She is a Roman Catholic who described in *America* magazine how her faith has influenced her life.

"To be Puerto Rican is to be the descendent of... African Moors and slaves, Taino Indians, Spanish colonizers, Jewish refugees and likely others. We are all of these things and something else all at once — we are Boricua." St. Mary Magdalen is honoring the different communities of our parish throughout 2022.


