A Message from Bishop Barber:

Vote “No” on Proposition 1

Every human life, including unborn human life, is unique and unrepeatable, a person with inherent dignity and an eternal destiny. The intentional taking of any innocent human life is a grave moral evil, and people of faith and goodwill have an obligation to protect human life and oppose all attacks against human life and dignity.

In California this year, voters are faced with a choice to keep the abortion law in our state as it is, or to vote in favor of a new constitutional amendment that would permanently expand and vastly increase abortions in our state, without doing anything to give vulnerable women a real choice. While we pray and work for the day when every human life, born and unborn, will be protected in law and welcomed in life, today we work to defeat this ballot initiative.

Proposition 1 isn't needed. Sadly, California already has some of the most permissive abortion laws in the nation that would remain in effect without the amendment, including our current limit on late-term abortions that are permitted only for the life and health of the mother. *Prop 1 destroys this common-sense limit.* California does not limit state spending on abortion, and with thousands more traveling from other states, the cost will be in the hundreds of millions. 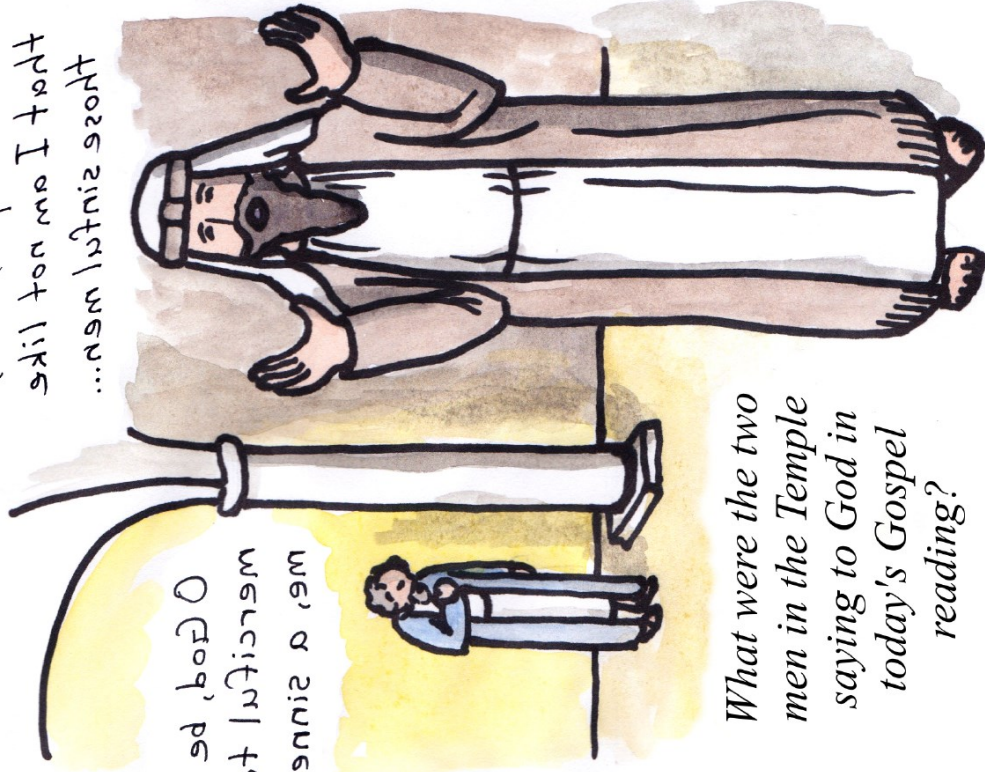
