



Notes from Fr. Nick

Reconciliation

Eucharist and *Reconciliation* are two sides of the same coin. Since the Second Vatican Council, the emphasis has been on the positive side of our relationship with God, and this was an overdue shift in Church teaching. It's important that we understand that *the foundation of our relationship with God is based in his love for us.* God's creation is good, and so human beings are, in their essence, good.

On the other hand, God also created us in freedom. Our goodness is not just rote behavior, but a choice.

In our complacency, sin enters the world. When we choose to place ourselves above God's will, we enter the realm of sin. Sin is basically selfishness, and all of us are guilty in one form or another.

While most Eucharistic liturgies begin with a penitential rite, they are primarily focused on the grace-filled side of our personality. The Sacrament of Reconciliation focuses on our tendency to turn from God's love. Attending Mass week after week while never sacramentally acknowledging the sinful side of our personality is a sure indication of an unbalanced spirituality.

I'm not advocating a return to the mentality that insisted one must receive absolution every time before they go to Communion



on Sunday, but *I think it is important to confess regularly*. This keeps our relation with God honest. Regular participation in the Sacrament of Reconciliation should be a part of our spiritual discipline. I think that confession every six-to-eight weeks is a good habit that shows spiritual maturity. At a minimum, one should celebrate the sacrament during Advent and Lent.

Monday night is your chance to acknowledge the negative side of your relationship with God. At 7:30 p.m. we will host our Reconciliation Service for Advent. If you decry the commercialization of Christmas, this is your chance to restore some sanctity to the season.


