



Notes from Fr. Nick

Our Parish Centennial

This weekend begins the celebration of St. Mary Magdalen Church's 100 years of service in North Berkeley. Archbishop Howard Hanna of San Francisco formally established Saint Mary Magdalen Parish on February

1st, 1923 and placed the friars of the Western Dominican Province in charge. On June 26th of that year, the Dominican Provincial assigned Fr. Francis Driscoll, OP, to be our first pastor, and the Dominican priests continued to lead our parish until my arrival on June 30th, 2017. Our church building was dedicated in August 1924. The School of the Madeleine opened in 1937 and continues the excellence established by the six Dominican sisters who originally staffed it. The Madeleine — still an affiliate school of the Dominican Sisters — is now the only Catholic elementary school in Berkeley.

A parish is much more than the building which houses it. With the Eucharist as the centerpiece of all we do, our parish is known for its dedication to social justice and proclamation of the Good News. We have too many programs and ministries to list here, but the Four Pillars of Dominican Spirituality have focused our parish's mission over the years, and still provide a framework for who we are:

- **Study** The School of the Madeleine and countless adult education programs have kept our parish abreast of Catholic Christian theology and spirituality since our inception. Recently (although curtailed by Covid-19), our Adult Sunday School provided the basics in religious education and a springboard to lively discussion. Our Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (<u>RCIA</u>) program has introduced the faith to numerous new believers. As well, our parish provides field education for students at the Graduate Theological Union and the Jesuit School of Theology of Santa Clara University.
- Prayer We are a liturgically rich parish that provides diverse liturgies and devotions for the community. Our <u>9:30 am choirs</u> and our <u>Scola Magdalena</u> offer superior liturgical music for worship. The Adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament complements our celebration of the Eucharist.
- Community Worship is lacking without a strong sense of community. In fact, the sacraments cannot take place without a gathered community. Our parish is strongly identified with the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and this gives us purpose and mission. Our mission is not limited to our church membership. We are deeply imbedded in the Berkeley community and share its commitment to the environment and human betterment. Our Sunday Meals for the Hungry, our Saint Vincent de Paul Conference, and our Peace & Justice Committee are just a sample of our parish's commitment.
- **Preaching** None of our community outreach and social justice would be meaningful unless seen in the context of proclaiming Christ's triumph over sin and death. Sermons and homilies may be the most visible expression of what and how we believe, but it is the living out of our belief that renders it meaningful.

There will be many events over the course of this year wherein we will celebrate our history and present, but we are essentially a forward-looking church. It is my hope that all our members, past and present, near and far, will join with us during this special year. I hope our centennial will inspire us to a strong future, continuing to proclaim the love of God on the streets of Berkeley.

The Story of the Founding of our Parish

In this, our centennial year, we are reprinting parts of our church history, taken from a monumental volume written by former Business Manager, the late Barb Gamba, in her spare time. Barb, who was also the Bulletin Editor, originally published her work in serial form in the Bulletin; the final 83-page volume (plus 36 pages of appendices) appeared in September of 1999. A commanding site has been secured on Milvia St. between Eunice and Berryman, on which the parish plant will be located. Until a church can be built services will be held every Sunday, commencing with next Sunday, August 5th, in the auditorium of Thousand Oaks School, Colusa and Tacoma Avenues, at 7:30 and 9:00 a.m. The school is one block from Thousand Oaks Station.

Trusting that you will communicate the good tidings to your Catholic neighbors within the parish limits, with best wishes for your health and happiness and praying God to bless you always, I remain,

Fr. Driscoll celebrated the first Mass within the new parish limits on his fifty-second birthday [and the feast day of our patroness], July 22nd, 1923, at the home of Martin & Olive Gavin, parishioners who lived at 810 The Alameda. The first Sunday Masses were held in the homes of Bert and Emma Hopps, 1231 Bonita Street, and Raphael and Rose Martinez, 734 The Alameda. It was clear from the beginning, however, that larger temporary facilities would be necessary to accommodate the 200 or so Catholic families who resided in the Thousand Oaks, Northbrae, and Cragmont districts.

There existed a very symbiotic relationship between the City of Berkeley and its churches in those days, and so we easily secured the use of the auditorium of the new **Thousand Oaks School** for our liturgies. On August 2nd, the same day that President Harding died unexpectedly in San Francisco, a letter was sent

to the Catholics in the parish announcing that the first public Masses would be celebrated at Thousand Oaks School the following Sunday.

Holding services in a school auditorium presented certain logistical problems, but our pioneering parishioners were ready, willing, and able to help. Bert Hopps built a folding altar, and he and his wife kept that as well as all of the other equipment and vestments in their home during the week. Bert and Emma were responsible for transporting all of this to the school on Sunday mornings, helping to arrange the makeshift sanctuary, and dismantling it in time for the Thousand Oaks Baptists, also building a new church, to use the auditorium at 11:00 a.m.

The number of children attending our early services was apparently large enough that, on November 11, 1923, a little blurb in the Berkeley Gazette announced that St. Mary Magdalen would conduct a Sunday School at 8:15 am, between its Masses, at its temporary location in the school. **Nancy Westphal Bonkofsky** and **Eileen Hopps Moran**, who were children when services were held at the school, recalled that chairs were set up in the hallway outside of the auditorium for this purpose. Asked how they remembered Fr. Driscoll, both Nancy and Eileen, without hesitation, replied, *"Oh, all the children were afraid of Fr. Driscoll!"*
