



Peace & Justice Notes

Sock Drive for Farmworkers March 4th & 5th

As Lent begins, in addition to the Rice Bowl Collection, the Peace and Justice committee is organizing a sock drive. This year's winter storms and flooding were devastating for farmworkers. One small central valley farming town, Planada, had to evacuate its entire population of 4000. Mostly low-income farmworkers, these families saw their homes, schools, and businesses flooded when a levee broke sending water from the Planada Canal into their town. The local St. Vincent de Paul has reached out and asked for help with a sock drive. We welcome new socks for adults and children to be dropped off when you come to the Vigil Mass on March 4th and morning Masses on Sunday, March 5th.

We will have well-marked boxes in the vestibule of the church and in Norton Hall. Thank you.

Tackling Gun Violence

Each Friday, Oakland Ceasefire, in partnership with local churches, sponsors evening walks to end gun violence. Why? To make visible our community's desire for an end to gun violence and commitment to policies that will achieve that outcome.

According to a recent poll by the University of Chicago Harris School of Public Policy and the Associated Press-NORC Center for Public Affairs Research, 71% of Americans say gun laws should be stricter, including about half of Republicans, the vast majority of Democrats, and even a majority of gun-owning households.

Ashes

February 22nd is Ash Wednesday. Did you ever wonder where the practice of receiving ashes came from? There is evidence that reception of ashes on this date goes back at least as far as the eighth century. In the late 900's, Aelfric, an English homilist, connected it to the penitential practice of wearing sackcloth and ashes mentioned in the Old and New Testaments.

In the early Church, Christians received ashes as a way of identifying with those who were doing penance. In those times, receiving forgiveness from the Church

entailed a lengthy period of public penance that might last until death.

Gradually, all Catholics began to participate in the practice on Ash Wednesday in order to mark the beginning of Lent.

Traditionally, the ash comes from palms distributed on the previous Palm Sunday. They were burnt on the feast of the Presentation of the Lord (*February* 2nd this year). The ashes are mixed with a small amount of olive oil so they will stick to the forehead.

As you receive ashes this Wednesday, recall that you are taking part in a tradition whose origins date back thousands of years ago. You are identifying with all those who are asking for the Lord's forgiveness, as well as expressing sorrow for your own failings.


Book Signing Next Sunday!

This book is a living testament to the transformative power of the Christian faith. It shows how peoples and cultures have found a way out of the blind alley of cultural quagmire, superstitions, fears, and moral paralysis through their faith in Jesus Christ.

The Word of God saved the Greco-Roman world from gods and goddesses, emperor worship, idols and other evils. It is a process that continues today. Some pundits speak of a post-Christian world, which is a gross misrepresentation of truth. On the contrary, the book exhibits the need for a re-christening of our world.

It is Fr. Augustine's hope and prayer that all those who read the book will be missionaries and messengers of the Word of God in their own surroundings.
