

As Lent begins, in addition to the Rice Bowl Collection, the Peace and Justice committee is organizing a sock drive. This year's winter storms and flooding were devastating for farmworkers. One small central valley farming town, Planada, had to evacuate its entire population of over 4000. Mostly low-income farmworkers, these families saw their homes, schools, and businesses flooded when a levee broke, sending water from the Planada Canal into their town. The local St. Vincent de Paul has reached out and asked for help with a sock drive. We welcome new socks for adults and children to be dropped

off when you come to the Vigil Mass on Saturday, March 4th or to one of the morning Masses on Sunday, March 5

We will have well-marked boxes in the vestibule of the church and in Norton Hall. Thank you.

Art & Faith


Many of you may know that I come from a family of artists. My father had a charmed childhood. His next-door-neighbor was Pulitzer Prize-winning author Marjorie Kennan Rawlings, whose best-known work, *The Yearling* (later made into a motion picture), brought a famous artist, N.C. Wyeth to North Florida to illustrate the book. My ten-year-old dad watched him work, and was to become an artist. My brothers, Tom and Steven, followed Dad's lead and are professional artists themselves.

While I chose not to pursue art as a career, I derive much pleasure from painting. I am not in the same league with my brothers, but I can paint competently enough. Painting doesn't require inordinate skill. The more a person paints, the better they can become.

From where does the drive to create art originate? Art has no practical value (despite how highly original or beautiful practical objects may be considered—a Grecian urn comes to mind). Yet art is made and valued by every culture in the world. I believe the human need to create comes from our desire to imitate God himself. We are made in the image and likeness of God, and our creative urge is a sign of the Creator's imprint on our beings.

Sometimes I think many people never attempt to make art because they believe they need to create something profound. This is too bad, because it stops a would-be artist before he or she gets started. While they may not be high art for the ages, cooking and gardening are part of our creative instinct, and thus connected to our godly nature. These activities are good places to start, but they don't produce anything lasting.

Consider taking on an artistic project. It could be quilting, furniture building, or one of the more traditional arts. I guarantee you'll be happy while you're doing it. You're work may frustrate you when it doesn't turn out as you'd planned, but the time spent will bring relaxation and focus. The deep satisfaction it brings will diminish your stress and strengthen your spirit.

Eucharistic Adoration (Holy Hour) will take place on all the Mondays of Lent, starting at 6:05 pm.


