



#### Notes from Fr. Nick

#### Ides of March

For the Romans, the **Ides of March** was the 74<sup>th</sup> day in their calendar; for us, it's March 15<sup>th</sup>. Romans had an astoundingly complicated way of calculating the day of the month, originally based on lunar cycles. They counted back from several fixed points in the month—*ides* being one of them. I'll leave it for you to research this because trying to understand it, frankly, left me a little dizzy. I suspect they missed many appointments on account of this system. Complexity seemed to be a characteristic of Roman thought. If you've ever tried to parse Latin grammar or do even simple arithmetic in Roman numerals, you'll get a feel for what I mean.

Beyond calculating time, the Ides of March marked several religious festivals sacred to the god, Jupiter. After being led through the city, sheep were sacrificed to the god. Although not directly parallel, the sacrifice of Christ, the Lamb of God, after walking the Via Dolorosa has similarities to this festival.

The Ides of March was also the deadline for payment of debts. It's probably not a coincidence that Income Tax Day was originally March 15th (and still is in Canada). In 1955, our own Tax Day was moved to April 15th, to give people more time to calculate their obligation and to avoid conflict with Patriot's Day in Massachusetts. Why would that be a problem? The Internal Revenue Service's processing center was in Andover, Massachusetts, and thus employees there had the day off!

Most of us know about the Ides of March because of the assassination of Emperor Julius Caesar, which occurred on that day in 44 B.C. In Plutarch's account, Caesar was on his way to the Theatre of Pompey when he joked to a seer, "Well, the Ides of March are come." to which the seer replied, "Aye, they are come, but they are not gone," indicating that the prophecy of his death would still be fulfilled. In Shakespeare's play, the seer simply says, "Beware the Ides of March."

For all the historical significance of March 15th, I will always remember it as my father's birthday.

Eucharistic Adoration (Holy Hour) takes place on all the Mondays of Lent, starting at 6:05 pm.


