

Peace & Justice Notes DACA 2023 Update

Last month, Senators Lindsey Graham (R-S. Carolina) and Dick Durbin (D-Illinois) introduced the bipartisan Senate Bill 365, which would protect young undocumented immigrants (those who were brought to this country as children) from deportation. It would further provide them an opportunity to obtain legal status, if they meet certain requirements.

These young immigrants – who are often referred to as *Dreamers* - have lived in the U.S. for nearly their whole lives. They were educated in U.S. schools, they are culturally American, but they continue to face an uncertain future without the rights of U.S. citizenship. Over the past few years, various courts and Congressional representatives have toyed with the status of Dreamers, yet have failed to pass meaningful immigration reform.

Another name for bipartisan Senate Bill 365 is "The Dream Act of 2023." It is currently being considered by the Senate Judiciary Committee. If this bill moves forward into law, the Act "...would allow approximately 1.9 million eligible Dreamers brought to America as children, including the roughly 600,000 current DACA recipients, to receive permanent protections to live and work in the U.S."

Wouldn't it be a wonderful fulfilment of Pope Francis's call to *"welcome the stranger"* if, after years of uncertainly, these young immigrants would be able to find a permanent home in the United States?

We encourage you to write to your Senators and ask them to vote for the 2023 version of The Dream Act. Even if you believe a Senator already supports a bill, the voices of her or his constituents still help them to convince other colleagues of a bill's urgency.

The Annunciation

There are only nine more shopping months until Christmas! Right here in the middle of Lent, while we prepare for Easter, we're reminded the Paschal mystery began with the Archangel Gabriel's announcement to Mary that she would become the Mother of God.

Our salvation came about not only from Jesus' death on the cross. The story of our salvation begins with the first evidence of God's entry into human history: the Annunciation. The sweep of salvation continues with Jesus' birth, childhood, baptism, public ministry, passion, death, Resurrection, and finally his Ascension back to heaven. It continues with Pentecost and the life of the Church.

This is the Paschal Mystery. When we celebrate one part of the Paschal Mystery, we are actually celebrating the entire mystery. Every time we participate in the Eucharist, we celebrate all of salvation history.

So here, in the depths of Lent, we can see the other end of the Paschal Mystery. The Annunciation is present, and we rejoice with Mary.


the world have a great need of Eucharistic adoration."


