


### Bread for the World Campaign— This Weekend!

### St. Catherine of Siena

The fourteenth century may rival the twentieth as the most calamitous in western history. Four major problems dominated life in Europe, and St. Catherine of Siena's life directly touched three of them: the Hundred-Years War between Britain and France, brigandage (highway terrorists), the Western Schism, and the Black Death.

Catherine was born on March 25, 1347, in the middle of the Black Death, or plague. Her mother, Lapa, must hold a record for childbearing; Catherine was the 22<sup>nd</sup> of 25 children (over half died during childhood). While Catherine died at 33 years of age, her mother lived to be 89.

Catherine's spirituality was extreme, to say the least. She vowed chastity at age seven and insisted on living a life of intense self-denial and isolation. As a young woman she became a Third-Order Dominican (a nun who lives outside a monastery). In an ecstatic vision, Catherine received the *stigmata* (the wounds of Christ) and was told to take on a public life.

As a public figure, St. Catherine traveled widely. She helped the poor, built hospitals, and brokered peace between warring Tuscan states. As an ambassador from Florence to the Papal court, she convinced Pope Gregory XI to return the Holy See to Rome. Catherine's writings are considered some of the greatest works in Tuscan literature, and she is credited with helping to form the modern Italian language.


Pope Pius II canonized St. Catherine in 1461. Her feast day was later established as April 29th, the day of her death. Pope Pius XI made her joint patron of Italy in 1940, along with Saint Francis of Assisi. In 1970, she and Teresa of Avila were given the title, "Doctors of the Church," the first women to be so honored.

St. Catherine's accomplishments must be seen against the background of her personal life. She was likely anorexic, and her extreme piety was either a symptom of neurosis or a means of coping with it. Nevertheless, her public accomplishments would have been exceptional for anyone; all the more so as a woman in an age when only men had status.




