

*In case you missed it:* this year's *Offering of Letters* are urging Congress to revise and then pass the **2023** Federal Farm Bill to include adequate food assistance through the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP); subsidies for organic and nutritious farm crops which in turn support school breakfast and lunch programs; and investments in ranching and farming practices that will reduce emissions and protect soil and water.

### Notes from Fr. Nick



Tomorrow begins the month of Mary, and so now is a good time to review our understanding of Mary's place in salvation history. Her role was established by the "Yes" she responded to the Archangel Gabriel when he announced she was to be the mother of the Christ. In order to prepare a fitting place for Jesus, God willed that she be without the stain of Original Sin from the moment she was conceived. This is the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception.

With her husband, Joseph, Mary was the archetype of a good parent, preparing the Son of God for His place in the human world and ultimately for His mission. Mary stood by Jesus throughout His life, even through His passion and death. Along with the other disciples, she was a witness to the Resurrection.

Among his last words on the cross, Jesus asked St. John to care for his mother, and legend has it that she traveled with John to his mission in Ephesus, where she eventually died. I had the privilege of visiting the site where Mary is said to have lived out her last years, high on a mountain above the city of Ephesus. The last doctrine proclaimed by the Church is that of the Assumption of Mary. It means that she was taken up to Heaven, body and soul. Her body did not suffer corruption, because was always free from Original Sin.

While Mary's role rests between the human world and the God's kingdom, the Church has never taught that Mary is divine. She was wholly human. Therefore we venerate her, but we do not worship her. Although in Heaven she reigns as a queen, Mary is no more a goddess than any of us will ever be. Her place in Heaven is the model for all human beings.

I find it interesting that almost all Catholics understand the distinction between Mary and God, but many non-Catholics accuse us of worshipping her. That's why it is important for all of us to make this distinction clear when people ask us about Mary's place in our Faith. As we honor Mary during May, let our knowledge of her role in our salvation deepen our faith. May her intercession help us on our way to God's kingdom.


