

Mother's Day

As children, we relied on our mothers for support, nourishment, protection and encouragement. As adolescents, we took them for granted, abused their kindness, and ignored their counsel. In our adulthood, mothers often become our friends and confidentes. During old age, many mothers begin to rely on their children. This weekend, we give thanks for our mothers. They brought us into the world and nurtured us to maturity, and so its appropriate we show our appreciation on this day.

While most of this can be said of fathers, there is a unique bond between mother and child that lasts a lifetime. Understanding this bond gives us a glimpse of our relationship with God. This is the feminine side of God. Like our mothers, God receives whatever we dish out. No matter what we do, God has an inexhaustible supply of grace for us. While mothers are finite, and there is a limit to their strength, they share this receiving characteristic with God.

Occasionally I have heard the objection that we shouldn't set aside one day for our mothers so we can take them for granted during the rest of the year.



I think this is a serious argument. However, I would counter that honoring some one on a specific



day serves as a reminder for us to recognize their specialness throughout the year.

Next month I will make my way back to North Florida for my mother's 95th birthday on June 15th. There is no denying that she will not be with our family for much longer. I cherish the fact she has remained with us for nearly a century, while I dread her loss, which will inevitably come. But for the moment, I can still revel in her comfort and be her "little boy." Thus, this Mothers' Day and those that are possibly in the future have a special poignancy for me.

Today, on this Mothers' Day, let us reflect on how our mothers accept us unconditionally and thank them for their love.
