



Notes from Fr. Nick

Ascension & First Eucharist / Confirmation

Why did Jesus ascend back into Heaven? Wouldn't it have been better for us if he had stuck around? He could have solved all the problems of the world. Poverty, war, and global warming could have been resolved without all the pain and suffering they have caused.

I believe *Jesus ascended to the Father in order to allow us to be the Church*. Had he never ascended, we could never mature into becoming His sacramental presence to the world. I recall my challenges as a freshman in college, learning to negotiate simple tasks that my parents would have handled for me only weeks earlier. Opening a checking account and budgeting my meager finances required me to think and plan in ways I could not have imagined when I was still living with my parents.

It is the same way with the Church. God loves us and trusts us so much that he delegates us to be his presence in and to the world. He has so much confidence in us that he allows us to make mistakes as we learn, just as good parents allow their children that freedom. We mature as a Church because we have to work out how to minister God's grace, even as we receive that grace from him. We would never mature into faithful ministers of grace, had Jesus remained with us here on earth.
