



Notes from Fr. Nick

Ninety-Five Years

I'll be in Florida for part of this coming week to celebrate the 95th birthday of my mother, Patricia Glisson. With each passing year it feels more important to celebrate. The reality is she will not be with us for many more.

My father left us four years ago, and Mom now lives in a nursing home. One of the benefits of nursing care is my mother's diet is monitored and she gets appropriate medication. In many ways, she is more alert and healthier now than she was just a few years ago. She also has the silver lining that my brother Tom is cared for in the same facility as she is. Tom has Parkinson's disease, which requires constant attention. Sad as this may be, he and our mother are living just a couple doors from each other, and so they have companionship.

My parents made an interesting pair. Dad was ever the explorer and risk-taker, while Mom was more domestic. Thanks to my father, my mother became a world traveler, artist, curator and editor of my father's work. Dad's spontaneity was balanced by my mother's thoroughness. She was the tether that kept my father rooted.

That said, my mother was always ready to participate in his adventures. While in the seminary, I remember meeting my mother at Miami International Airport on one day's notice. Dad needed her in Argentina, and so she dropped everything for a six-month hiatus in South America! On the other hand, Mom would rein my father in when she deemed his risk-taking too high. One evening she appeared from the kitchen and announced, "Sell the airplane." There was no more discussion—Dad got rid of his plane. In more recent years, both of them stayed closer to home. Neither of them visited me since I moved to St. Mary Magdalen.

For me, more than anything else, my mother has been the nurturing, warm presence and spiritual center of our family. I cherish the time we still have together, and I hope you won't mind my occasional departures from the parish to be near to her.


