Parish Centennial Cruise

The Canterbury Tales is one of the most important works of English literature. Across 20 tales, Geoffrey Chaucer sketched the personalities of pilgrims thrown together on a pilgrimage to Canterbury Cathedral in the late 14th century. Chaucer used the literary device of a story-telling contest among the group as a means of exposing the character of each participant. What might be overlooked is the liminal state these travelers were in, which opened them up to expressing themselves more openly than if they had been in familiar surroundings.

I hope this same dynamic will accompany our parish cruise to Alaska next week. Getting away from familiar surroundings and visiting new places is a wonderful experience, but for me the highlight of the trip is the people I travel with and the new ones I meet. I've been to Alaska more times than I can count, but I'm ready to do it again, because I love the company of my fellow travelers and the new friendships I make.




