# Notes from Fr. Nick

# St. Dominic

Tuesday, August 8th, will be the feast of Saint Dominic. Dominic was born in 1170, the son of prominent parents in the town of Caleruega, Spain. He was named in honor of Saint Dominic of Silos, patron of barren mothers and of the Lord's Day (Sunday is *Domingo* in Spanish).

There is a story that shortly after his mother made a pilgrimage to the shrine of Dominic of Silos — while trying to get pregnant — she had a dream. In the dream, a dog leapt from her womb carrying a torch in his mouth, setting the world on fire. This story probably emerged after the order Dominic founded became known as the *Dominicans*; a play on the Latin name *Dominicanus* is *Domini canus*, "Dog of the Lord." This term, in turn, refers to the order's chief charism: *preaching*. The Dominicans are officially known as the *Ordo Praedicatorum*, the Order of Preachers.

Early in his career, Dominic concentrated on his studies, but when a famine broke out in Spain, he sold all his clothes and even the manuscripts he was studying. As he explained to his fellow students, "Would you have me study off these dead skins, when men are dying of hunger?"

In 1215, Dominic established his order following the monastic rules of Saint Benedict and he was given authority to preach. This was the year of the Fourth Lateran Council, and he traveled to Rome to ask Pope Innocent III's approval for his order. A year later, in 1216, the new pope, Honorius III, officially recognized the order.

The order established its headquarters at the basilica of Santa Sabina in Rome, where it remains today. Dominic spent the remainder of his life preaching and starting new monasteries throughout Europe.

The Dominicans quickly established a reputation for scholarship which they enjoy today. Eclipsing even Dominic himself in fame is Saint Thomas Aquinas, a Dominican known in and out of the Church as one of the greatest intellects in Western history.

As most of you know, our parish was founded and staffed by the Dominicans for most of our history; one of the figures in our triptych is of St. Dominic. I am happy that we still have strong to ties to the Order of Preachers, and that our parish school is still affiliated with the Dominican Sisters of Mission San José. The Dominican charisms of *prayer*, *study*, *community* and *preaching* still guide us and help define who we are.




