
Preparation classes take place on the first Monday of the month. BAPTISM: Please call the parish office for more information.



Notes from Fr. Nick

Assumption

In October 2009, Fr. Tom Parenti and I visited the shrine near Ephesus in modern-day Turkey where one tradition has it that Mary lived out her days. The story is that St. John cared for Mary after Jesus' death. When he moved from Palestine to preach in the port of Ephesus, Mary accompanied him there, and lived on the top of a mountain near that city.

Today, the site of Mary's home is covered in olive trees; a truly serene and beautiful spot. The only ancient ruins at the site is an excavation of a large baptismal pool. Maybe the most impressive thing about the shrine is the numbers of people visiting from all over the world and from many different faiths. We tend to forget that many Moslems venerate Mary.

In 1949, Pope Pius XII proclaimed the doctrine of Mary's Assumption in the document *Munificentissimus Deus*. It codified traditional Catholic teaching that Mary was assumed body and soul into Heaven. (Orthodox and Anglicans have the same belief.) This is a completion of the logic beginning with her Immaculate Conception. If Mary never had the stain of Original Sin from her birth, then her death would not be like that of other people. Thus she rose to Heaven, as did her son.

Because, unlike Mary, we experience sin, our spirit and body are separated at death. The Church teaches that at the end of time our bodies will be reunited

with our souls and the Kingdom of God will be fully inaugurated.

If you find yourself trying to resolve the logical gaps in this teaching, remember that it is one of the mysteries of our relationship with God. This side of death, we'll never fully understand it. It is rather, a mystery to be pondered.


