# Fr. Louis Vitale, OFM 1932~2023

We are saddened to learn that Fr. Louis Vitale, OFM, died on September 6<sup>th</sup> at the age of 91. A

Franciscan friar and sociologist, he was an ardent activist for peace who was convinced that Jesus calls us, his followers, to reject all forms of violence, including war and any preparations for war.

Inspired by St. Francis of Assisi, Mahatma Gandhi



and Martin Luther King, Jr., he participated in non-violent civil disobedience on numerous occasions, for which he was arrested more than 400 times.

Fr. Vitale was particularly outspoken in his condemnation of WHINSEC (formerly called the *School of the Americas*), where the Latin American military receives training in "counterinsurgency", but which has been accused of promoting the use of torture. As did Berkeley priest Fr. Bill O'Donnell earlier, he served six months in Federal prison for his "third act of conscience" against the military school. In 2004, he spoke eloquently about the scandal of Abu Ghraib, stating: "as a nation, we have crossed a line we had pledged we would never cross" (a reference to the U.S. having signed the 1975 U.N. declaration against the use of torture).

Fr. Vitale was a co-founder of *Pace e Bene Non-violence Service*, which fosters a more peaceful and just world through nonviolence education, community building and action, as well as the *Nevada Desert Experience*, which organizes public witnesses against nuclear testing.


In other ways, too, "Father Louie," as he was affectionately called, was a faithful disciple of Jesus. As pastor of St. Boniface in San Francisco's Tenderloin for 12 years, he allowed homeless men to sleep in the church pews without fear of harassment. In 2016 he published his memoir, *Love is What Matters: Writings on Peace and Nonviolence*.

All those who knew him will miss his unfailing optimism and sense of humor. May Father Louie enjoy his well-earned rest!

# Catechetical Sunday

At the 9:30 am Mass this Sunday, I will lead a blessing for all teachers and students. Catechetical Sunday honors dedicated teachers and all the students who learn from them. We use the term "catechist" when we talk about our teachers in a religious context. Catechists are far more committed than an instructor would be; catechists practice what they preach.



The faculty at our school, the volunteers in our

religious education programs, and the many fine teachers and professors who work in other institutions are truly dedicated people. Teachers give far more than time in the classroom. They spend days creating lesson plans, engaging the visual arts, and researching the internet. They worked years to obtain their degrees and continue to spend many hours maintaining their credentials.

There is another dimension to being a catechist and teacher that requires a different kind of investment. The dimension that separates them from mere instructors is that catechists spend a great deal of their time deeply involved in their students' lives. When teachers give their personal selves, sharing their faith with each student, their impact is of a different order of magnitude from just communicating knowledge: they thereby become the sacramental presence of Christ.
