Last Sunday's 9:30 am Mass was bilingual, with the support of the Spanish Choir from St. Ambrose!










## Notes from Fr. Nick

## Saints Simon & Jude

We know very little about Saints Simon and Jude. Both were Apostles, and they share October 28<sup>th</sup> as their feast day. Jesus chose them to proclaim the Good News and to receive others into his faith community through baptism. The description of their call from the Gospels indicates that they may have been members of Jesus' extended family.



There is an unreliable tradition that Simon and Jude ministered in Persia and Mesopotamia. Tradition also has it that they were martyred, and thus would have died at some time during the first century A.D. The Church honors these apostles by mentioning them in the First Eucharistic Prayer, or the "Roman Canon."

In addition, their names also give us some insight into their personalities. Simon was called "the Zealot". This attribute usually means that a person is strongly committed to a cause. We therefore might infer that he had great zeal for Christ and the Gospel. However, it is more likely that Simon was affiliated with a group

dedicated to the overthrow of the Roman government before joining Christ's followers.

Jude was also called Thaddeus, which means "courageous." This could be a reference to his zeal for the early Church, or it may refer to the tone of a <u>short Epistle attributed to him</u> in the New Testament. This Epistle warns against people who have infiltrated a church and are creating dissension. The author tells his followers to be charitable but wary.

Although most of their lives' work has been lost to history, we honor Simon and Jude as men chosen by Christ to proclaim the Gospel and who gave their lives for it.
