### Notes from Fr. Nick

Feast of All Saints

Every priest is required to make a retreat at least once a year. I had planned mine to take place last month, but events outside my control forced me to postpone it. As you can imagine, finding time in the last two months of the year has been challenging. I had already committed to being the chaplain of a cruise after Thanksgiving, and so it worked out that this week was the only reasonable time left. Unfortunately, this means I'll be away over All Saints Day, a Holy day. You can be assured that liturgy for the Solemnity will continue as normal and Fathers Chris and Ken — as well as Deacon Jeff, who will be preaching — will take good care of you.

The Feast of All Saints is on our calendar to assure all the saints who don't get a special day on the church calendar are remembered. The tune to the Hymn *"For All the Saints"* is called *Sine Nomine*, which in Latin means "without name." In other words, this day is for all the nameless people who have lived exemplary lives in the eyes of God without official Church recognition.

In a culture pervaded by social media, entertainment, and politics, we can fall into the trap of believing that a lack of recognition equals a lack of importance. Unlike my brothers and father, who have built beautiful churches, painted wonderful paintings, and written well-received books, I will probably leave no significant material reminders of my being here. When the last person dies who knew or knew of me, my life will pass out of memory. Other than some entries in local record books here and in Rome, I will apparently pass out of existence.

Were it not for sainthood, this might be a depressing thought. But I will still be present in the mind of God, as will all of us. Not only that, our faith teaches that ours will not be a lonely existence. We believe in the Communion of Saints. We believe we will stand together with our families, friends, ancestors, and all of humanity who have accepted God's love and mercy. Worldly recognition pales in comparison.

This is what the feasts of All Saints and All Souls is all about. Not only is it a moment for humanity here on earth to remember those countless souls, it is also a source of great hope here and now for all who labor in God's work without fame or acknowledgement.
