The Virgin of Guadalupe and the Latino Psyche

Our Lady of Guadalupe embraces the Mexican psyche unlike anything known to us here in North America. The majority of Mexicans (and most Latin Americans in general) are more strongly attached to her than we are to George Washington or to the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The peoples south of our border identify with the Virgin of Guadalupe in ways most of the rest of us do not understand.



I suppose much of her appeal stems from the fact that Mary appeared to Juan Diego, a humble indigenous peasant, instead of to a nobleman or a conquistador. She became a symbol of hope to millions of people with no status at all. The Virgin of Guadalupe is thus the Peoples' Saint.

Perhaps a parallel can be seen in Israel's exodus from bondage in Egypt led by the mysterious God, Yahweh. Israel's God was their advocate, but He also formed them into a people—He gave them an identity, and with that identity came confidence. These lowly people were no longer mere pawns of the powerful; they became capable of forming a common, dignified life.

For Christians, Mary was both created by Yahweh and the mother of His Son. At the same time, she is not some distant queen, but one who nurtures—mothers—us all. At the macro level, her advocacy encouraged Mexicans to resist the forces of empire and conquerors to help chart their own destiny. At the personal level, the Virgin of Guadalupe is an example and intercessor in people's daily lives.

Rulers and politicians have tried to coopt the strong symbolism of *la Guadalupana*, but they could never eradicate it. Thanks to the Virgin, the needs of the poor and lowly are always a part of Mexican politics. Her influence makes Mexican politicians, officials, and common people more inclusive in their decisions.

Would that people of the United States have such a strong saint like the Virgin of Guadalupe influencing all aspects of our lives! Perhaps our market economy might become a little more humane. Perhaps we would become more united as a country.

As we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe this Tuesday, we should remember that she is the patroness of all South *and* North America. Indeed, she is our advocate as well, and our prayers to her might make us into a stronger, more caring, people.

Holiday Outreach Giving Tree




