






We are honored to have <u>Agbonkhianmeghe Orobator</u>, SJ, the new Dean of the Jesuit School of Theology (Santa Clara University) as our Keynote Speaker this year. Fr. Orobator grew up in Benin City, Nigeria, practicing traditional African religion. Fluent in four languages, Dean Orobator received his Ph.D in theology from the University of Leeds (England). Among his books are *Religion and Faith in Africa: Confessions of an Animist* and *The Pope and the Pandemic: Lessons in Leadership in a Time of Crisis*.

Catholic Schools Week

The School of the Madeleine makes our parish unique in Berkeley. Not only do we have the only parish school in town, but the school strongly affects the character of our parish. At the demographic level, this makes our congregation much younger than many parishes without a school. A large part of our ministry is directed to young people, and the future Church is a strong part of our outlook.

Having a school requires a large part of a pastor's time. Not only do I attend school events and sit on the School Board but (among many other things) I hire the principal, sign contracts, and participate in the school's budget and fund raising activities. Many priests are reluctant to be assigned as pastor to parishes with schools, but I'm convinced that Catholic schools are an essential element in the Church's health and growth. (I say this even though, sadly, I had to close the school in my last parish in Oakland.)



Recognizing our school's role in the future of our parish and Church, I hope you stand firmly behind the School of the Madeleine. Even if you don't currently have children in our school, it needs your support. Consider some ways in which you can care for our school:

- Encourage people (particularly Catholics) in your neighborhood to enroll their children. We are not at full capacity, and we offer generous scholarships for people who can't afford full tuition.
- Volunteer your time. Our principal, Joseph Nagel, and our vice principals, Jennifer Walwark, Heather Skinner, and Michael Stokes, have plenty of projects or tasks for which your help could prove invaluable.
- Support the school financially. Our "MAD" Annual Fund and "Pass It On" Foundation can always use your help providing tuition assistance and capital improvements.
- Make your support for Catholic schools known to our government. Other states have programs that assist Catholic and private schools. This helps everyone, by taking some of the load off public schools and by providing families with a variety of options to educate their children.
