



Holy Week



Liturgists have a maxim regarding worship: "The older a ritual is, the quirkier." Holy Week is a case study, because so much is jammed into the liturgy that must take place over three days. And each part of the Triduum is so jam-packed with rites that it can hardly contain them.

Holy Thursday's part of the Triduum — the Mass of the Lord's Supper — not only commemorates the institution of the Eucharist, but also welcomes the Holy Oils, celebrates the Mandatum (foot washing), and concludes with a procession of the Eucharist.



Good Friday is the only day in the year when Mass is not celebrated. Instead we proclaim the Lord's Passion, venerate the cross, and receive the Eucharist that was consecrated on Holy Thursday.



The *General Instruction on the Roman Missal* rightfully calls the Easter Vigil "The Mother of all Liturgies." We begin in darkness with the lighting of the Easter fire. Then we process into the church illuminated only by the light of our candles. After the *Exultet* is sung, we launch into an extended celebration of the Word that covers the entire sweep of Salvation History. Next comes the celebration the Sacraments of Initiation in which new members become Christians. After all these liturgies, we will celebrate Eucharist as a community.

In some ways we might think of the Triduum as akin to grand opera. So much is going on that we are overcome by the enormity of the experience. Although the rituals may make little rational sense, we come away from the experience with a deeper understanding of God's magnificent love and care for us.

Come celebrate with us this week! It will require more personal investment than watching entertainment on your devices, but the payoff is much better. You'll have a deeper sense of God's relationship with you, and you will have strengthened your own commitment to the People of God.




