Mother's Day

The origins of Mother's Day are an ancient celebration that goes back to the Greeks, who observed the feast of Cybele, the mother of the gods, and it was celebrated around the Vernal Equinox. The Romans called their feast *Matronalia*, which was dedicated to the goddess Juno Lucina, and was celebrated on March 1st.. Mothers received gifts from their husbands and daughters, and their servants were given the day off so they could be with their families. In the more recent past, the Catholic and Anglican

Churches honored motherhood on Laetare Sunday, the fourth Sunday of Lent.

Modern Mother's Day began in the United States in 1870, when Julia Ward Howe called for a day to celebrate mothers' shaping of society politically — it was called the *Mother's Day Proclamation*. President Woodrow Wilson eventually signed a proclamation marking Mother's Day in 1913.



In 1912, Anna Jarvis created the Mother's Day International Association, which trademarked the phrases "Second Sunday in May" and "Mother's Day." Jarvis specifically spelled *Mother's* in the possessive singular to emphasize that it was to be a day when families would honor their mothers, rather than a day to commemorate universal motherhood.

Anna Jarvis' point about the spelling of Mother's Day is well taken. It's easy to espouse high ideals in general, but they are meaningless unless carried out in the particular. If you haven't already, take some time to honor your mother with a phone call, a dinner out, or some other kind act. While we should do this all year, Mother's Day emphasizes the debt we owe to our mothers.

St. Mary Magdalen Parish Celebrates Asian-American Catholics

Gene Luen Yang

(1973-present)



Gene Luen Yang (楊 謹 倫) is an American cartoonist, teacher, and frequent lecturer on the subjects of graphic novels and comics at comic book conventions and universities, schools, and libraries. He taught computer science and was the Director of Information Services at Bishop O'Dowd High School in Oakland. In 2012, Yang joined the faculty at Hamline University in St. Paul, Minnesota, as a part of the Low-Residency Master of Fine Arts in Writing for Children and Young Adults (MFAC) program.

In 2006, Gene Luen Yang's American Born Chinese became the first graphic novel to become a National Book Award finalist and to win the American Library Association's Printz Award. His next project, the two-volume Boxers & Saints (with Lark Pien), required several years of rewrites after the editor announced that his nearly-finished comic novel simply wasn't good enough to publish. Yang and Pien pushed through, however, and Boxers & Saints later won the Los Angeles Times Book Prize and garnered Yang a second National Book Award nomination.



Among other projects, Yang developed the graphic novel iteration of Nickelodeon's popular cartoon, Avatar: The Last Airbender. In 2016, the U.S. Library of Congress named him its Ambassador for Young People's Literature, and he became the third graphic novelist to receive a MacArthur Fellowship.

"I think Spiderman is an awesome example of learning about failure. He has a great character arc in which he started off in failure.... The very first thing he did as a superhero was fail, so his entire career is built on that one failure. It just shows, I think, that failure can be fruitful. Good things can come out of failure."


Feast of the Ascension

Forty days after Jesus rose from the dead he went up a hill with His followers and disappeared through the clouds and went up into Heaven.






