

The Racial Wealth Gap (RWG) Learning Simulation



The average U.S. White family owns 13x the wealth of the average Black family. This unconscionable disparity is responsible for unequal access to decent housing, quality health care, advanced education, healthy food, clean water, and public safety in our country.

What is the RWG Learning Simulation? It is an interactive tool whereby participants learn just how thirteen Federal policies—from Andrew Johnson's Land Policies of 1865 to the GI Bill of 1944—have unjustly prevented generations of Black families from creating intergenerational wealth.

How does it work? From 10 to 50 members of any group (church, organization, classroom, office) sit around tables, collectively experiencing the economic impact of these policies by receiving (or losing) money cards, land cards, or lost opportunity cards, depending on whether participants chose to be "Black" or "White" at the start of the simulation.

The Impact. This is *not* a simple parlor game. Even those who are very knowledgeable about racial injustice in the U.S. will find this 90-minute simulation to be a powerful learning experience.

East Bay Reparations Awareness & Advocacy (EBRAA)

EBRAA is an interfaith group committed to conducting RWG simulations throughout the Bay Area. Through this engaging training, participants will gain a deeper understanding of the impacts of Federal policies that have determined access to opportunity, resources, and power for generations.



Sacraments & Sacramentals

We all know there are seven sacraments in the Catholic Church: *Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Reconciliation, Marriage, Holy Orders and Anointing of the Sick*. Since the Second Vatican Council, we have also made the Assembly of Believers and Proclamation of the Word equal in status with the seven sacraments, but we don't call them as such.

Sacraments are the realities of Christ's presence when the community of believers gathers and celebrates them while hearing the Scriptures proclaimed. Sacraments are not simply signs or symbols of God — they are the reality of God himself. That is, they realize God's presence.

I take comfort in knowing that, other than being a willing participant, I don't have to do anything to make the sacraments work. After I minister the Anointing of the Sick in the hospital or to somebody approaching death, I often

tell them: "Whatever can be said of your physical health, we can be sure you are in good spiritual health." Sacraments are God's grace for us without our willing it.

What, then, is a "sacramental"? They are religious symbols one step below a sacrament. Statues, relics, icons, paintings, and other holy objects can unite us with God's presence, but do not cause grace on their own. Whereas

sacraments are essential to our faith, sacramentals are optional. Moreover, they are not universal. What moves one person to prayer does not necessarily move another. For example, the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe is a cause of great devotion in Latin America, but it does not have the same spiritual power in the Orthodox world.

At the Second Vatican Council, the decision was taken to restore the preeminence of the Seven Sacraments, because devotions to the sacramentals had come to diminish the importance of sacraments themselves. Many people had become fanatical in their devotion to sacramentals. Claims of healings from the likes of water from Lourdes or the Miraculous Metal bordered on the magical.

Nevertheless, sacramentals occupy an important place in our spiritual lives. We might think of them as the spice in a good recipe. Wearing a scapular or contemplating a holy image reminds us of our faith at odd moments of the day, while the sacraments remain key events in our spiritual lives. The icons, shrines, and symbols in our church remind us of what is central to our faith and lend warmth to the sacred space.


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
