

Notes from Fr. Nick

Ash Wednesday & Lent

This week has more than enough happening! Much of it is because Easter falls so late this year.

At St. Mary Magdalen in recent years we have used the Sunday before Ash Wednesday to burn the palms we received last Holy Thursday to make ashes for the Ash Wednesday liturgies. Pulverized and blended

with a little olive oil, they will mark our foreheads as we begin fasting and preparing for Easter.

Most of us know that *mardi gras* is French for "Fat Tuesday." In many parts of the world it is a bacchanal before the rigors of Lent. The word *Carnival* is also used for the celebration in many parts of the world, and is said to derive from the Latin *carne vale*, meaning "farewell to meat."

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence in the Church. **Fasting** means one full meal plus two



small meals which, combined, will not equal a single normal meal. Nothing should be consumed between meals besides water. The fast applies to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. **Abstinence** means no meat for the day. Abstinence from meat is required for people 14 and over on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent. People with special dietary needs are excepted, but should try to exercise some other form of penance.

For me, Lent is like listening to an opera by Richard Wagner; I both dread and enjoy it. I suppose there is an infantile part of me that dislikes the idea of any restrictions, and so I'm glad it only lasts six weeks. But Lent is also a time when I become more focused. Easter preparations begin early on and I anticipate the beauty and glory of the resurrection celebration. It requires a level of discipline I would not engage strictly for self-improvement. I feel similarly about the music of Richard Wagner. It isn't "easy listening." I must invest some discipline in listening to the composer's long and complex works. But, the reward at the end is a deeper appreciation of their structure and beauty.

May this Lent bring all of you many blessings.

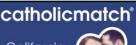
