

Mother's Day



Easter 2025 was my first celebration of the feast since my mother died. While I experienced a minor sense of grief, I mainly felt a sense of “rightness” that she was celebrating the Resurrection in Paradise. Her life accomplished, she is now able to see Christ’s salvation from the perspective of a life well-lived, rather than worrying about things yet to be done. Also, my mother can now be an advocate for her family and friends near the throne of God, following the pattern she started here on earth.

Beyond bearing us five children into the world and nurturing us to adulthood, my mother stuck up for us even when we did not deserve it. Whether it was defending us when my father erred too much on the side of justice rather than love, standing by me as I struggled through elementary and high school, or comforting my brother as he went through a divorce, my mother was loyal to us, regardless of our innocence or guilt. She epitomized Christ’s absolute and unqualified love.

Mom was not always perfect. She occasionally showed a petty streak, and we all learned to be organized as a defense against her clutter. There were times when she would pout or be manipulative, but these were rare exceptions to a life lived with integrity.

Writing my mother’s obituary was a cathartic experience for me (see: tinyurl.com/PatriciaGlisson). It afforded me an opportunity to consider her life as a whole. It also enabled me to see the strong impact she had on so many people’s lives. While she may not have had my father’s flair, she was a rock where my family and many others found a sure footing.

If your mother is deceased, consider the impact she had on your worldview. If she is still alive, treasure the time you have with her. Someday even the difficult moments you share may become memories you hold dear.

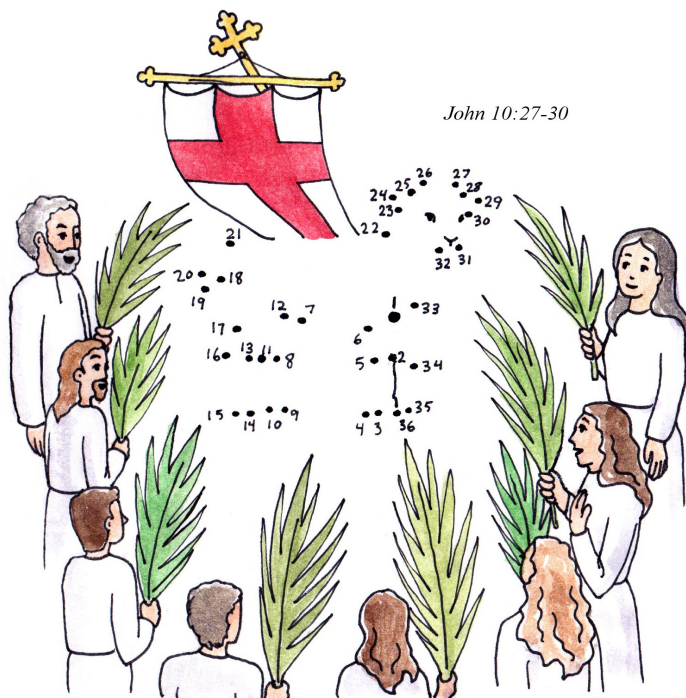

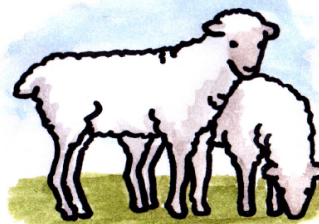
