


Eligibility: Open to all members of the parish and the wider community. Submissions from youth (Grades 5 through 8) are especially welcome.

Notes from Fr. Nick

Latino School Enrollment



Beginning next Sunday, our principal, Mr. Nagel, and I will attend a conference at the University of Notre Dame run by **ALMA** — the **Latino Enrollment Institute** for principals of Catholic schools and their pastors. We know that a diversified student body contributes to a dynamic learning environment. Although our students at the School of the Madeleine represent many cultures, the majority of them come

from upper-middle-class households and are predominantly of European heritage. There is nothing wrong with this, but we all benefit from more contact with cultures and stations in life other than our own.

Maybe more importantly, we would like to attract more children whose lives could be transformed by attending our school. The Madeleine provides a top-notch education, builds character, fosters social engagement, and is prayer-centered. Our school can take an average student and enable them to excel.

Attendance in all schools (including public) is down slightly from its peak in the early 2000s, and so most of our classrooms have seats available to be filled. Full enrollment and the revenue it brings results in more resources for all our students. Our faculty, administration, and Parent Association are working toward that goal.

The School of the Madeleine is very fortunate to have an endowment that can make our tuition reasonable for most families. Unfortunately, some cultures do not consider a Catholic education for their children. In Mexico, for example, religion is taught as a class in most public schools, and many parents feel that Catholic schools are only for the very poor or the very rich.

When people emigrate from traditionally Catholic countries to the United States, most of them are not aware of the sharp line drawn here between religion and the state. They do not understand that moral issues are generally omitted from the curriculum. The lack of moral underpinning in public education makes family cultural values difficult to maintain. Religious education in the parish can make up for some of this lack, but there is no substitute for the intense immersion students receive in a Catholic school. The Madeleine provides this extremely well.

Mr. Nagel and I have worked with Fr. Joe Corpora, C.S.C., and Notre Dame's **Alliance for Catholic Education** for many years. When Fr. Joe offered a conference on attracting Latino students to our school, we thought the trip would definitely be worth our while. Hopefully, we'll learn much about appealing to these families' strong values that will help us make a case for Latino children attending our school. Please keep us in your prayers next week.

Do you have school-aged children who are not attending Catholic school? Or how about your grandchildren or children of a neighbor? We have scholarships that can bring the School of the Madeleine within reach of most families. We are committed to these children receiving a superior education that will make them well-rounded and committed citizens for the future.
